Definitions of "Commander" as a noun

- *A rank of naval officer, above lieutenant commander and below captain.*
- *A person in authority, especially over a body of troops or a military operation.*
- *A commissioned naval officer who ranks above a lieutenant commander and below a captain.*
- *An officer in the airforce.*
- *An officer in command of a military unit.*
- *An officer in charge of a Metropolitan Police district in London.*
- *A member of a higher class in some orders of knighthood.*
- *Someone in an official position of authority who can command or control others.*



Synonyms of "Commander" as a noun (12 Words)

air force officer	A slight wind (usually refreshing).
boss	A person responsible for hiring workers. <i>Does he see you as a partner or is he already the boss.</i>
chief	A leader or ruler of a people or clan. <i>The chief of police.</i>
commandant	An officer in command of a military unit. <i>The camp commandant.</i>
controller	A person in charge of an organization's finances. <i>The speed controller on his turntable was not working properly.</i>
director	Member of a board of directors. <i>The sales director.</i>
head	The head regarded as the location of intellect imagination and memory. <i>The head of the hammer.</i>
headman	The head of a tribe or clan.
leader	(in the UK) a member of the government officially responsible for initiating business in the House of Commons or House of Lords. <i>A leader in the use of video conferencing.</i>
manager	(in the Houses of Parliament and the US Senate) a member of a committee appointed by one house to confer with a similar committee of the other house. <i>The team manager.</i>
master	Someone who holds a master s degree from academic institution. <i>Follow in the footsteps of the masters and paint in locations made famous by their work.</i>

overseer

A person who supervises others, especially workers.



Usage Examples of "Commander" as a noun

- *The commander of a paratroop regiment.*



Associations of "Commander" (30 Words)

<u>armament</u>	Military weapons and equipment. <i>Armaments</i> factories.
<u>armed</u>	Characterized by having or bearing arms. <i>A lion rampant argent armed and langued azure.</i>
<u>armored</u>	Protected by armor (used of persons or things military).
<u>army</u>	The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare. <i>An army of photographers.</i>
artillery	Large-calibre guns used in warfare on land. <i>Tanks and heavy artillery.</i>
battalion	An army unit usually consisting of a headquarters and three or more companies. <i>A battalion of ants.</i>

<u>brigade</u>	Form into a brigade. <i>The anti smoking brigade.</i>
brigadier	A general officer ranking below a major general.
cantonment	A military garrison or camp.
centurion	(ancient Rome) the leader of 100 soldiers.
colonel	A rank of officer in the army and in the US air force above a lieutenant colonel and below a brigadier or brigadier general.
commando	A unit of commandos. <i>A commando attack.</i>
corps	A main subdivision of an army in the field, consisting of two or more divisions. <i>Diplomatic corps.</i>
deploy	Bring into effective action. <i>Small states can often deploy resources more freely.</i>
<u>disarm</u>	(of a country or force) give up or reduce its armed forces or weapons. <i>Police yesterday disarmed a parcel bomb.</i>
grenadier	Deep-sea fish with a large head and body and long tapering tail.
<u>horde</u>	A nomadic community. <i>Tartar hordes.</i>
<u>legion</u>	A vast number of people or things. <i>Legions of photographers and TV cameras.</i>
legionary	A soldier in a Roman legion. <i>The legionary fortress of Isca.</i>
martial	Befitting a warrior. <i>Martial law.</i>
<u>military</u>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>Military uniforms.</i>
militia	Civilians trained as soldiers but not part of the regular army. <i>Small detachments of militia.</i>
muster	Assemble (troops), especially for inspection or in preparation for battle. <i>Reporters mustered outside her house.</i>
naval	Connected with or belonging to or used in a navy. <i>A naval base.</i>
regiment	Assign to a regiment. <i>The whole regiment of women MPs.</i>
<u>soldier</u>	Serve as a soldier in the military. <i>I soldiered with your father on his last four campaigns.</i>

squad

A small squad of policemen trained to deal with a particular kind of crime.
*An assassination **squad**.*

subaltern

Inferior in rank or status.
*The private tutor was a recognized **subaltern** part of the bourgeois family.*

tank

As much as a tank will hold.
*A large class of 0 6 0 **tanks**.*

tribune

An official elected by the plebeians to protect their interests.
