Definitions of "Commander" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "commander" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A rank of naval officer, above lieutenant commander and below captain.
- A person in authority, especially over a body of troops or a military operation.
- A commissioned naval officer who ranks above a lieutenant commander and below a captain.
- An officer in the airforce.
- An officer in command of a military unit.
- An officer in charge of a Metropolitan Police district in London.
- A member of a higher class in some orders of knighthood.
- Someone in an official position of authority who can command or control others.

chief	A leader or ruler of a people or clan. <i>The chief of police.</i>

controller	A person in charge of an organization's finances. The speed controller on his turntable was not working properly.
director	Member of a board of directors. <i>The sales director</i> .
head	The head regarded as the location of intellect imagination and memory. <i>The head of the hammer.</i>
headman	The head of a tribe or clan.
leader	(in the UK) a member of the government officially responsible for initiating business in the House of Commons or House of Lords. A leader in the use of video conferencing.
manager	(in the Houses of Parliament and the US Senate) a member of a committee appointed by one house to confer with a similar committee of the other house. <i>The team manager</i> .
master	Someone who holds a master s degree from academic institution. Follow in the footsteps of the master s and paint in locations made famous by their work.



overseer A person who supervises others, especially workers.

<u>disarm</u>	(of a country or force) give up or reduce its armed forces or weapons. Police yesterday disarm ed a parcel bomb.
grenadier	Deep-sea fish with a large head and body and long tapering tail.
<u>horde</u>	A nomadic community. Tartar horde s.
<u>legion</u>	A vast number of people or things. <i>Legions of photographers and TV cameras.</i>
legionary	A soldier in a Roman legion. The legionary fortress of Isca.
martial	Befitting a warrior. <i>Martial</i> law.
<u>military</u>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>Military</i> uniforms.
militia	Civilians trained as soldiers but not part of the regular army. Small detachments of militia .
muster	Assemble (troops), especially for inspection or in preparation for battle. <i>Reporters</i> muster ed outside her house.
naval	Connected with or belonging to or used in a navy. A naval base.
regiment	Assign to a regiment. The whole regiment of women MPs.
<u>soldier</u>	Serve as a soldier in the military. I soldier ed with your father on his last four campaigns.



<u>squad</u>	A small squad of policemen trained to deal with a particular kind of crime. <i>An assassination squad</i> .
subaltern	Inferior in rank or status. The private tutor was a recognized subaltern part of the bourgeois family.
<u>tank</u>	As much as a tank will hold. A large class of 0 6 0 tank s.
trihune	An official elected by the plebeians to protect their interests
