equal Make equal uniform corresponding or matching.

The total debits should **equal** the total credits.

In amounts or parts that are the same in size.

Deal **equally** with rich and poor.

equilibrium A calm state of mind.

evenhanded Without partiality.

fair Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner.
