<b>according to</b>	In agreement with or accordant with.
<b>appropriate to</b>	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc.
<b><a href="#">comparable</a></b>	Able to be compared or worthy of comparison. <i>The situation in Holland is <b>comparable</b> to that in England.</i>
<b>consistent with</b>	Capable of being reproduced.
<b>correspondent</b>	Corresponding.
<b>corresponding</b>	Similar especially in position or purpose. <i>Boxes with <b>corresponding</b> dimensions.</i>
<b>corresponding to</b>	Conforming in every respect.

<b>equal</b>	Evenly or fairly balanced. <i>Add <b>equal</b> amounts of water and flour.</i>
<b>equivalent</b>	Belonging to the same equivalence class. <i>One unit is <b>equivalent</b> to one glass of wine.</i>
<b>in accordance with</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in keeping with</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in line with</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in proportion with</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>proportional</b>	Having a constant ratio. <i>The punishment should be <b>proportional</b> to the crime.</i>
<b>proportionate</b>	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i><b>Proportionate</b> representation of a minority group.</i>
<b>proportionate to</b>	Being in due proportion.
<b>relative to</b>	Properly related in size or degree or other measurable characteristics; usually followed by `to.

## Usage Examples of "Commensurate" as an adjective

- *Such heavy responsibility must receive commensurate reward.*
- *Salary will be commensurate with age and experience.*
- *Pay should be commensurate with the time worked.*

## Associations of "Commensurate" (30 Words)

<b>alike</b>	Used to show that something applies equally to a number of specified subjects. <i>They dressed <b>alike</b> in black trousers and jackets.</i>
<b>analogous</b>	Similar or equivalent in some respects though otherwise dissimilar. <i>Salmon roe is marketed as <b>analogous</b> to caviar.</i>
<b>as</b>	Used to emphasize an amount. <i>It <b>tasted</b> like grape juice but not <b>as</b> sweet.</i>
<b>balanced</b>	Keeping or showing a balance; in good proportions. <i>A properly <b>balanced</b> symphony orchestra.</i>
<b>comparable</b>	Conforming in every respect. <i>Nobody is <b>comparable</b> with this athlete.</i>
<b>compare</b>	Estimate, measure, or note the similarity or dissimilarity between. <i>John <b>compared</b> his haircut to his friend s.</i>

<b>conformable</b>	(of a person) disposed or accustomed to conform to what is acceptable. <i>Personalities <b>conformable</b> to the ambient level of cultural evolution.</i>
<b>congruent</b>	In agreement or harmony. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely <b>congruent</b>.</i>
<b>consistently</b>	In every case or on every occasion; invariably. <i>A team that <b>consistently</b> demonstrates a desire to win.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>The total debits should <b>equal</b> the total credits.</i>
<b>equally</b>	In amounts or parts that are the same in size. <i>Deal <b>equally</b> with rich and poor.</i>
<b>equilibrium</b>	A calm state of mind. <i>The <b>equilibrium</b> level of income.</i>
<b>evenhanded</b>	Without partiality. <i><b>Evenhanded</b> justice.</i>
<b>fair</b>	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>They set sail with a <b>fair</b> wind.</i>
<b>identical</b>	Expressing an identity. <i><b>Identical</b> twins are monovular.</i>
<b>immobility</b>	Remaining in place. <i>The disorder is caused by long periods of <b>immobility</b>.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The twins were <b>indistinguishable</b>.</i>
<b>interchangeable</b>	Such that the arguments or roles can be interchanged. <i><b>Interchangeable</b> electric outlets.</i>
<b>liken</b>	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>match</b>	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>The jacket and trousers do not <b>match</b>.</i>
<b>par</b>	A par score at a hole. <i>Woosnam had advanced from his overnight position of three under <b>par</b>.</i>
<b>prescribed</b>	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>In <b>prescribed</b> order.</i>
<b>proportionate</b>	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i><b>Proportionate</b> representation of a minority group.</i>
<b>relative</b>	Of a clause attached to an antecedent by a relative word. <i>Earnings <b>relative</b> to production.</i>

<b>same</b>	Same in identity. <i>Curtains the <b>same</b> color as the walls.</i>
<b>similar</b>	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They wore <b>similar</b> coats.</i>
<b><u>stable</u></b>	Shelter in a stable. <i>Prices have remained relatively <b>stable</b>.</i>
<b>symmetrical</b>	Having similarity in size, shape, and relative position of corresponding parts. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and <b>symmetrical</b>.</i>
<b>synonymous</b>	(of a word or phrase) having the same meaning as another word or phrase in the same language. <i>His deeds had made his name <b>synonymous</b> with victory.</i>
<b><u>twin</u></b>	A twin engined aircraft. <i>The <b>twin</b> problems of economic failure and social disintegration.</i>
