according to	In agreement with or accordant with.
appropriate to	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc.
comparable	Able to be compared or worthy of comparison. <i>The situation in Holland is comparable to that in England.</i>
consistent with	Capable of being reproduced.
correspondent	Corresponding.
corresponding	Similar especially in position or purpose. <i>Boxes with corresponding dimensions.</i>
corresponding to	Conforming in every respect.

equal	Evenly or fairly balanced. <i>Add equal amounts of water and flour.</i>
equivalent	Belonging to the same equivalence class. <i>One unit is equivalent to one glass of wine.</i>
in accordance with	Currently fashionable.
in keeping with	Currently fashionable.
in line with	Currently fashionable.
in proportion with	Directed or bound inward.
<u>proportional</u>	Having a constant ratio. <i>The punishment should be proportional to the crime.</i>
proportionate	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
proportionate to	Being in due proportion.
relative to	Properly related in size or degree or other measurable characteristics; usually followed by `to.

- *Such heavy responsibility must receive commensurate reward.*
- *Salary will be commensurate with age and experience.*
- *Pay should be commensurate with the time worked.*

Associations of "Commensurate" (30 Words)

alike	Used to show that something applies equally to a number of specified subjects. <i>They dressed alike in black trousers and jackets.</i>
<u>analogous</u>	Similar or equivalent in some respects though otherwise dissimilar. <i>Salmon roe is marketed as analogous to caviar.</i>
as	Used to emphasize an amount. <i>It tasted like grape juice but not as sweet.</i>
balanced	Keeping or showing a balance; in good proportions. <i>A properly balanced symphony orchestra.</i>
<u>comparable</u>	Conforming in every respect. <i>Nobody is comparable with this athlete.</i>
compare	Estimate, measure, or note the similarity or dissimilarity between. <i>John compared his haircut to his friend s.</i>

conformable	(of a person) disposed or accustomed to conform to what is acceptable. <i>Personalities conformable to the ambient level of cultural evolution.</i>
congruent	In agreement or harmony. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely congruent.</i>
consistently	In every case or on every occasion; invariably. <i>A team that consistently demonstrates a desire to win.</i>
equal	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>The total debits should equal the total credits.</i>
equally	In amounts or parts that are the same in size. <i>Deal equally with rich and poor.</i>
equilibrium	A calm state of mind. <i>The equilibrium level of income.</i>
evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>They set sail with a fair wind.</i>
identical	Expressing an identity. <i>Identical twins are monovular.</i>
immobility	Remaining in place. <i>The disorder is caused by long periods of immobility.</i>
indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The twins were indistinguishable.</i>
interchangeable	Such that the arguments or roles can be interchanged. <i>Interchangeable electric outlets.</i>
liken	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
match	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>The jacket and trousers do not match.</i>
par	A par score at a hole. <i>Woosnam had advanced from his overnight position of three under par.</i>
prescribed	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>In prescribed order.</i>
proportionate	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
relative	Of a clause attached to an antecedent by a relative word. <i>Earnings relative to production.</i>

same	Same in identity. <i>Curtains the same color as the walls.</i>
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They wore similar coats.</i>
stable	Shelter in a stable. <i>Prices have remained relatively stable.</i>
symmetrical	Having similarity in size, shape, and relative position of corresponding parts. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and symmetrical.</i>
synonymous	(of a word or phrase) having the same meaning as another word or phrase in the same language. <i>His deeds had made his name synonymous with victory.</i>
twin	A twin engined aircraft. <i>The twin problems of economic failure and social disintegration.</i>
