### **Definitions of "Communicative" as an adjective**

- *Willing, eager, or able to talk or impart information.*
- *Able or tending to communicate- W.M.Thackeray.*
- *Able or tending to communicate.*
- *Relating to the conveyance or exchange of information.*



## Synonyms of "Communicative" as an adjective (12 Words)

### **candid**

Truthful and straightforward; frank.  
*I gave them my **candid** opinion.*

**communicatory** Able or tending to communicate.

### **expansive**

(of a person or their manner) relaxed and genially frank and communicative.  
*An **expansive** lifestyle.*

### **expressive**

Effectively conveying thought or feeling.  
*The spires are **expressive** of religious aspiration.*

### **forthcoming**

Ready or made available when wanted or needed.  
*She had never been **forthcoming** about her time in the States.*

### **frank**

Open, honest, and direct in speech or writing, especially when dealing with unpalatable matters.  
***Frank** enjoyment.*

<b>informative</b>	Providing useful or interesting information. <i>A thought provoking <b>informative</b> article.</i>
<b>open</b>	Full of small openings or gaps. <i>An <b>open</b> fire.</i>
<b>outgoing</b>	Leaving an office or position. <i>Incoming and <b>outgoing</b> calls.</i>
<b>uninhibited</b>	Not inhibited or restrained. <i><b>Uninhibited</b> exuberance.</i>
<b>unreserved</b>	Not set apart for a particular purpose or booked in advance. <i>He has had their <b>unreserved</b> support.</i>
<b>vocal</b>	Relating to the human voice. <i>He was <b>vocal</b> in condemning the action.</i>

## Associations of "Communicative" (30 Words)

### anecdotal

Characterized by or fond of telling anecdotes.  
*Her book is **anecdotal** and chatty.*

### **blazon**

Report (news), especially in a sensational manner.  
*The book contains tens of thousands of **blazons** of arms held by English families.*

### chat

Birds having a chattering call.  
*I have **chatted** to a few women on the Net.*

<b>confabulate</b>	<i>She has lapses in attention and concentration—she may be confabulating a little.</i>
<b>description</b>	A type or class of people or things. <i>It is laughably easy to buy drugs of all <b>descriptions</b>.</i>
<b>dialog</b>	A literary composition in the form of a conversation between two people.
<b>digression</b>	A message that departs from the main subject. <i>Let s return to the main topic after that brief <b>digression</b>.</i>
<b>distensible</b>	Capable of being distended; able to stretch and expand. <i>The stomach is a <b>distensible</b> organ.</i>
<b><u>euphoric</u></b>	Exaggerated feeling of well-being or elation. <i>A <b>euphoric</b> sense of freedom.</i>
<b><u>expansive</u></b>	Friendly and open and willing to talk. <i><b>Expansive</b> beaches.</i>
<b><u>expressive</u></b>	Characterized by expression. <i>A very <b>expressive</b> face.</i>
<b>fluency</b>	The quality or condition of being fluent. <i><b>Fluency</b> in spoken and written English is essential.</i>
<b>garrulous</b>	Excessively talkative, especially on trivial matters. <i>A <b>garrulous</b> cab driver.</i>
<b><u>glib</u></b>	(of words or a speaker) fluent but insincere and shallow. <i><b>Glib</b> generalizations.</i>
<b>heraldic</b>	Of or relating to heraldry. <i><b>Heraldic</b> devices.</i>
<b>lengthiness</b>	Amount or degree or range to which something extends.
<b>locution</b>	An utterance regarded in terms of its intrinsic meaning or reference, as distinct from its function or purpose in context. <i>His impeccable <b>locution</b>.</i>
<b>loquacious</b>	Full of trivial conversation. <i>Never <b>loquacious</b> Sarah was now totally lost for words.</i>
<b>loquacity</b>	The quality of talking a great deal; talkativeness. <i>He was renowned for <b>loquacity</b>.</i>
<b><u>narrative</u></b>	In the form of or concerned with narration. <i>His <b>narrative</b> was interesting.</i>

<b>recitative</b>	Musical declamation of the kind usual in the narrative and dialogue parts of opera and oratorio, sung in the rhythm of ordinary speech with many words on the same note. <i>Singing in <b>recitative</b>.</i>
<b>rhapsodize</b>	Recite a rhapsody. <i>He began to <b>rhapsodize</b> about Gaby s beauty and charm.</i>
<b>speak</b>	Communicate in or be able to communicate in (a specified language). <i>Insufficient air circulates for the pipes to <b>speak</b>.</i>
<b>talkative</b>	Fond of or given to talking. <i>The <b>talkative</b> driver hadn t stopped chatting.</i>
<b>verbal</b>	A verbal statement containing a damaging admission alleged to have been made to the police and offered as evidence by the prosecution. <i>A <b>verbal</b> adjective.</i>
<b>verbose</b>	Using or containing too many words. <i><b>Verbose</b> and ineffective instructional methods.</i>
<b>vocal</b>	A part of a piece of music that is sung. <i>The <b>vocal</b> apparatus.</i>
<b>volubility</b>	The quality of being facile in speech and writing. <i>Her legendary <b>volubility</b> deserted her.</i>
<b>voluble</b>	(of a person) talking fluently, readily, or incessantly. <i>An excited and <b>voluble</b> discussion.</i>
<b>wordy</b>	Using or expressed in rather too many words. <i>A <b>wordy</b> and repetitive account.</i>
