## **Communism as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Communism" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “communism” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.*
- *A form of socialism that abolishes private ownership.*
- *A theory or system of social organization in which all property is owned by the community and each person contributes and receives according to their ability and needs.*



## Synonyms of "Communism" as a noun (4 Words)

- collectivism** A political theory that the people should own the means of production. *The Russian Revolution decided to alter the course of modernity towards **collectivism**.*
- radical socialism** Two or more atoms bound together as a single unit and forming part of a molecule.
- socialism** Policy or practice based on the political and economic theory of socialism.
- state ownership** A state of depression or agitation.



## Associations of "Communism" (30 Words)

- conservative** Unimaginatively conventional- Newsweek.  
*Police placed the value of the haul at a **conservative** 500 000.*
- coup** (among some North American Indian peoples) an act of touching an armed enemy in battle as a deed of bravery, or an act of first touching an item of the enemy's in order to claim it.  
*It was a major **coup** to get such a prestigious contract.*
- demagogue** A political leader who seeks support by appealing to popular passions and prejudices.  
*A gifted **demagogue** with particular skill in manipulating the press.*
- democracy** A state governed under a system of democracy.  
*The intended extension of industrial **democracy**.*
- democratic** Representing or appealing to or adapted for the benefit of the people at large.  
***Democratic** countries.*

<b>despotism</b>	Dominance through threat of punishment and violence. <i>Some nations are democracies others are <b>despotisms</b>.</i>
<b>dictatorship</b>	A country governed by a dictator. <i>The effects of forty years of <b>dictatorship</b>.</i>
<b>fascism</b>	(in general use) extreme authoritarian, oppressive, or intolerant views or practices. <i>This is yet another example of health <b>fascism</b> in action.</i>
<b>fascist</b>	A person who is very intolerant or domineering in a particular area. <i>I m a bit of a spelling <b>fascist</b> but still have blind spots over words like privilege or separate.</i>
<u><b>government</b></u>	The study of government of states and other political units. <i>Tyrannical <b>government</b>.</i>
<b>ideology</b>	The set of beliefs characteristic of a social group or individual. <i>The <b>ideology</b> of republicanism.</i>
<b>illiberal</b>	Not generous; mean. <i><b>Illiberal</b> and anti democratic policies.</i>
<u><b>liberal</b></u>	Showing or characterized by broad-mindedness. <i><b>Liberal</b> amounts of wine had been consumed.</i>
<b>liberalism</b>	An economic theory advocating free competition and a self-regulating market. <i>Representative democracy operates under the principles of classical <b>liberalism</b>.</i>
<b>liberalist</b>	A person who favors a political philosophy of progress and reform and the protection of civil liberties.
<b>libertarian</b>	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>No true <b>libertarian</b> would ever support a culture where citizens must show their papers to travel.</i>
<b>militarism</b>	The belief that a country should maintain a strong military capability and be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national interests. <i>The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of <b>militarism</b>.</i>
<b>monocracy</b>	A system of government by one person only.
<b>nihilist</b>	Someone who rejects all theories of morality or religious belief. <i>It is impossible to argue against a <b>nihilist</b>.</i>
<b>political</b>	Interested in or active in politics. <i><b>Political</b> policy.</i>
<u><b>politician</b></u>	A person who acts in a manipulative and devious way, typically to gain advancement within an organization. <i>A veteran communist <b>politician</b>.</i>



<b>presidential</b>	Relating to a president or presidency. <i>The <b>presidential</b> palace.</i>
<b><u>progressive</u></b>	A progressive tense or aspect. <i>The most <b>progressive</b> art school in Britain.</i>
<b><u>radical</u></b>	Markedly new or introducing radical change. <i>A <b>radical</b> verb form.</i>
<b><u>regime</u></b>	A coordinated programme for the promotion or restoration of health a regimen. <i>A tax <b>regime</b>.</i>
<b><u>republic</u></b>	A political system in which the supreme power lies in a body of citizens who can elect people to represent them. <i>The community of scholars and the <b>republic</b> of learning.</i>
<b>revolution</b>	A single orbit of one object around another or about an axis or centre. <i>The <b>revolution</b> of the earth about the sun takes one year.</i>
<b><u>revolutionary</u></b>	Of or relating to or characteristic or causing an axial or orbital turn. <i>The <b>revolutionary</b> army.</i>
<b>socialism</b>	Policy or practice based on the political and economic theory of socialism.
<b>totalitarianism</b>	A system of government that is centralized and dictatorial and requires complete subservience to the state. <i>Democratic countries were fighting against <b>totalitarianism</b>.</i>
