Communism as a Noun

Definitions of "Communism" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “communism” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.*
- *A form of socialism that abolishes private ownership.*
- *A theory or system of social organization in which all property is owned by the community and each person contributes and receives according to their ability and needs.*



Synonyms of "Communism" as a noun (4 Words)

- collectivism** A political theory that the people should own the means of production. *The Russian Revolution decided to alter the course of modernity towards **collectivism**.*
- radical socialism** Two or more atoms bound together as a single unit and forming part of a molecule.
- socialism** Policy or practice based on the political and economic theory of socialism.
- state ownership** A state of depression or agitation.



Associations of "Communism" (30 Words)

- conservative** Unimaginatively conventional- Newsweek.
*Police placed the value of the haul at a **conservative** 500 000.*
- coup** (among some North American Indian peoples) an act of touching an armed enemy in battle as a deed of bravery, or an act of first touching an item of the enemy's in order to claim it.
*It was a major **coup** to get such a prestigious contract.*
- demagogue** A political leader who seeks support by appealing to popular passions and prejudices.
*A gifted **demagogue** with particular skill in manipulating the press.*
- democracy** A state governed under a system of democracy.
*The intended extension of industrial **democracy**.*
- democratic** Representing or appealing to or adapted for the benefit of the people at large.
***Democratic** countries.*

despotism	Dominance through threat of punishment and violence. <i>Some nations are democracies others are despotisms.</i>
dictatorship	A country governed by a dictator. <i>The effects of forty years of dictatorship.</i>
fascism	(in general use) extreme authoritarian, oppressive, or intolerant views or practices. <i>This is yet another example of health fascism in action.</i>
fascist	A person who is very intolerant or domineering in a particular area. <i>I m a bit of a spelling fascist but still have blind spots over words like privilege or separate.</i>
<u>government</u>	The study of government of states and other political units. <i>Tyrannical government.</i>
ideology	The set of beliefs characteristic of a social group or individual. <i>The ideology of republicanism.</i>
illiberal	Not generous; mean. <i>Illiberal and anti democratic policies.</i>
<u>liberal</u>	Showing or characterized by broad-mindedness. <i>Liberal amounts of wine had been consumed.</i>
liberalism	An economic theory advocating free competition and a self-regulating market. <i>Representative democracy operates under the principles of classical liberalism.</i>
liberalist	A person who favors a political philosophy of progress and reform and the protection of civil liberties.
libertarian	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>No true libertarian would ever support a culture where citizens must show their papers to travel.</i>
militarism	The belief that a country should maintain a strong military capability and be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national interests. <i>The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of militarism.</i>
monocracy	A system of government by one person only.
nihilist	Someone who rejects all theories of morality or religious belief. <i>It is impossible to argue against a nihilist.</i>
political	Interested in or active in politics. <i>Political policy.</i>
<u>politician</u>	A person who acts in a manipulative and devious way, typically to gain advancement within an organization. <i>A veteran communist politician.</i>

presidential	Relating to a president or presidency. <i>The presidential palace.</i>
<u>progressive</u>	A progressive tense or aspect. <i>The most progressive art school in Britain.</i>
<u>radical</u>	Markedly new or introducing radical change. <i>A radical verb form.</i>
<u>regime</u>	A coordinated programme for the promotion or restoration of health a regimen. <i>A tax regime.</i>
<u>republic</u>	A political system in which the supreme power lies in a body of citizens who can elect people to represent them. <i>The community of scholars and the republic of learning.</i>
revolution	A single orbit of one object around another or about an axis or centre. <i>The revolution of the earth about the sun takes one year.</i>
<u>revolutionary</u>	Of or relating to or characteristic or causing an axial or orbital turn. <i>The revolutionary army.</i>
socialism	Policy or practice based on the political and economic theory of socialism.
totalitarianism	A system of government that is centralized and dictatorial and requires complete subservience to the state. <i>Democratic countries were fighting against totalitarianism.</i>
