### Definitions of "Communist" as a noun

<b>radical socialist</b>	An atom or group of atoms with at least one unpaired electron; in the body it is usually an oxygen molecule that has lost an electron and will stabilize itself by stealing an electron from a nearby molecule.
<b>socialist</b>	A political advocate of socialism. <i>She was a lifelong <b>socialist</b>.</i>

## Synonyms of "Communist" as an adjective (5 Words)

<b>collectivist</b>	Relating to the practice or principle of giving a group priority over each individual in it. <i><b>Collectivist</b> policies which promised security and protection.</i>
<b>communistic</b>	Relating to or marked by communism. <i><b>Communistic</b> propaganda.</i>
<b>leftist</b>	Believing in or supporting tenets of the political left. <i><b>Leftist</b> rebels.</i>
<b>radical socialist</b>	Arising from or going to the root or source.
<b>socialist</b>	Advocating or following the socialist principles. <i>The history of <b>socialist</b> movement.</i>

- anarchy** A state of disorder due to absence or non-recognition of authority or other controlling systems.  
*He must ensure public order in a country threatened with **anarchy**.*
- bourgeois** A bourgeois person.  
*A self confessed and proud **bourgeois**.*
- capitalist** Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists.  
***Capitalist** countries.*
- collective** A collective farm.  
*A **collective** sigh of relief from parents.*

<b>competitive</b>	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>A <b>competitive</b> sport.</i>
<b><u>coup</u></b>	(among some North American Indian peoples) an act of touching an armed enemy in battle as a deed of bravery, or an act of first touching an item of the enemy's in order to claim it. <i>It was a major <b>coup</b> to get such a prestigious contract.</i>
<b><u>decree</u></b>	Issue a decree. <i>The King <b>decreed</b> that all firstborn males should be killed.</i>
<b>demagogue</b>	A political leader who seeks support by appealing to popular passions and prejudices. <i>A gifted <b>demagogue</b> with particular skill in manipulating the press.</i>
<b><u>firebrand</u></b>	A piece of wood that has been burned or is burning. <i>A political <b>firebrand</b>.</i>
<b>heaven</b>	Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace. <i>The everlasting happiness with God that we call <b>heaven</b>.</i>
<b>idealistic</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style. <i><b>Idealistic</b> young doctors who went to work for the rebels.</i>
<b>incendiary</b>	An incendiary bomb or device. <i><b>Incendiary</b> bombs.</i>
<b>insurgent</b>	A person fighting against a government or invading force; a rebel or revolutionary. <i>An attack by armed <b>insurgents</b>.</i>
<b>libertarian</b>	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>No true <b>libertarian</b> would ever support a culture where citizens must show their papers to travel.</i>
<b>nationalize</b>	Make national in character or scope. <i>Mitterand <b>nationalized</b> the banks.</i>
<b>nihilist</b>	An advocate of anarchism. <i>It is impossible to argue against a <b>nihilist</b>.</i>
<b><u>politician</u></b>	A person who is professionally involved in politics, especially as a holder of an elected office. <i>A veteran communist <b>politician</b>.</i>
<b>privatize</b>	Change from governmental to private control or ownership. <i>The oil industry was <b>privatized</b>.</i>
<b><u>proletariat</u></b>	Working-class people regarded collectively (often used with reference to Marxism). <i>The growth of the industrial <b>proletariat</b>.</i>



<b><u>radical</u></b>	Markedly new or introducing radical change. <i>In the body free <b>radicals</b> are high energy particles that ricochet wildly and damage cells.</i>
<b><u>rebel</u></b>	Take part in a rebellion renounce a former allegiance. <i><b>Rebel</b> forces.</i>
<b>redistribute</b>	Distribute anew. <i><b>Redistribute</b> the troops more strategically.</i>
<b><u>revolutionary</u></b>	Involving or causing a complete or dramatic change. <i>The <b>revolutionary</b> army.</i>
<b>seeditious</b>	In opposition to a civil authority or government. <i>The letter was declared <b>seeditious</b>.</i>
<b>socialist</b>	Advocating or following the socialist principles. <i>She was a lifelong <b>socialist</b>.</i>
<b><u>sublime</u></b>	Cause a substance to sublime. <i>These crystals could be <b>sublimed</b> under a vacuum.</i>
<b><u>subversive</u></b>	A subversive person. <i>The government claimed we were <b>subversives</b> or terrorists.</i>
<b><u>utopia</u></b>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. <i>Misplaced faith in political <b>utopias</b> has led to ruin.</i>
<b>wealth</b>	Plentiful supplies of a particular resource. <i>He used his considerable <b>wealth</b> to bribe officials.</i>
