equivalent	Belonging to the same equivalence class. <i>A wish that was equivalent to a command.</i>
in the same class as	Holding office.
in the same league as	Currently fashionable.
like	Equal in amount or value. <i>They looked utterly alike.</i>
near	Located on the nearside of a vehicle. <i>Walking in these shoes is the nearest thing to floating on air.</i>
of the same standard as	Equal in amount or value.
on a level with	Of the score in a contest.
on an equal footing with	Having the same quantity, value, or measure as another.
<u>parallel</u>	Involving the simultaneous performance of operations. <i>Parallel lines never converge.</i>
<u>proportional</u>	(of a variable quantity) having a constant ratio to another quantity. <i>The punishment ought to be proportional to the crime.</i>
proportionate	Exhibiting equivalence or correspondence among constituents of an entity or between different entities. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
related	Connected by kinship, common origin, or marriage. <i>Painting and the related arts.</i>
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They wore similar coats.</i>

alike	(of two or more people or things) similar to each other. <i>All politicians are alike.</i>
<u>analogous</u>	(of organs) performing a similar function but having a different evolutionary origin, such as the wings of insects and birds. <i>Salmon roe is marketed as analogous to caviar.</i>
analogy	The religious belief that between creature and creator no similarity can be found so great but that the dissimilarity is always greater any analogy between God and humans will always be inadequate. <i>The models show by analogy how matter is built up.</i>
as	A United States territory on the eastern part of the island of Samoa. <i>Birds were singing and the child sang as sweetly.</i>
assonance	The repetition of similar vowels in the stressed syllables of successive words. <i>Alliterative assonances such as fail and fall are very common in Old English poetry.</i>
compare	Examine and note the similarities or differences of. <i>Beyond compare.</i>
<u>congruent</u>	(of figures) identical in form; coinciding exactly when superimposed. <i>The rules may not be congruent with the requirements of the law.</i>
corresponding	Accompanying. <i>A number of corresponding diagonal points.</i>
<u>ditto</u>	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>The next speaker dittoed her argument.</i>
equal	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>1 litre is roughly equal to 1 quart.</i>
<u>equate</u>	Be equivalent or parallel, in mathematics. <i>You cannot equate success in financial matters with greed.</i>
equivalent	The atomic weight of an element that has the same combining capacity as a given weight of another element; the standard is 8 for oxygen. <i>The French equivalent of the Bank of England.</i>
<u>homogeneous</u>	Consisting of parts all of the same kind. <i>A homogeneous society.</i>
<u>identical</u>	Coinciding exactly when superimposed. <i>Identical twins are monovular.</i>
indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>They wore indistinguishable hats.</i>

like	Conforming in every respect. <i>The like period of the preceding year.</i>
liken	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
likeness	Picture consisting of a graphic image of a person or thing. <i>Humans are described as being made in God's likeness.</i>
quasi	Having some resemblance. <i>A quasi success.</i>
<u>resemblance</u>	A way in which two or more things are alike. <i>The physical resemblances between humans and apes.</i>
similar	A person or thing similar to another. <i>Problems similar to mine.</i>
similarity	The quality of being similar. <i>The similarity of symptoms makes them hard to diagnose.</i>
similarly	Used to indicate a similarity between two facts or events. <i>A similarly priced property.</i>
similitude	Similarity in appearance or character or nature between persons or things. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply similitude.</i>
symmetrical	Made up of exactly similar parts facing each other or around an axis; showing symmetry. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and symmetrical.</i>
synonymous	(of words) meaning the same or nearly the same. <i>His deeds had made his name synonymous with victory.</i>
<u>tantamount</u>	Equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as. <i>His statement was tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i>
<u>twin</u>	A twin engined aircraft. <i>There was a bruise on his cheek a twin to the one on mine.</i>
undersell	Promote or value (something) insufficiently. <i>She feels she was underselling herself by putting her disability high on her CV.</i>
