
## **Compartment as a Verb**

# Synonyms of "Compartment" as a verb (11 Words)

break up	Become punctured or penetrated.
carve up	Form by carving.
cut up	Form by probing, penetrating, or digging.
dismember	Divide into pieces. The tiger <b>dismember</b> ed the tourist.
<u>divide</u>	Make a division or separation. Can you <b>divide</b> 49 by seven.
divide up	Perform a division.
separate	Separate into parts or portions. The two pieces that we had glued <b>separate</b> d.
slice up	Hit a ball so that it causes a backspin.
<u>split</u>	(of an issue) cause (a group) to be divided because of opposing views. The river had <b>split</b> into a number of channels.
split up	Go one's own way; move apart.
subdivide	Form into subdivisions. The heading was <b>subdivide</b> d into eight separate sections.

# Associations of "Compartment" (30 Words)

airliner	A large passenger aircraft.
<u>ballast</u>	Make steady with a ballast. The track was laid with rails and <b>ballast</b> ed with earth.
bulkhead	A dividing wall or barrier between separate compartments inside a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle.
cupboard	A recess or piece of furniture with a door and typically shelves, used for storage. A broom <b>cupboard</b> .
debark	Leave a ship or aircraft. The ship would simply sail into the harbour dock and begin <b>debark</b> ing troops.
deck	A floor of a double decker bus. <i>He stood on the <b>deck</b> of his flagship.</i>



defrost	Remove frost or ice from (the windscreen of a motor vehicle). <b>Defrost</b> the turkey slowly.
disembark	Go ashore. The passengers began to <b>disembark</b> .
disembarkation	The act of passengers and crew getting off of a ship or aircraft.
dishwasher	A machine for washing dishes.
<u>dock</u>	Come into dock. <b>Dock</b> the ships.
embarkation	The act of passengers and crew getting aboard a ship or aircraft.
expeditionary	Of or forming an expedition, especially a military expedition. The French <b>expeditionary</b> force in Indochina.
freezer	Electric refrigerator (trade name Deepfreeze) in which food is frozen and stored for long periods of time. <i>There are some steaks in the</i> <b>freezer</b> .
fridge	A refrigerator in which the coolant is pumped around by an electric motor. She put the carton of milk back in the <b>fridge</b> .
hull	Remove the hulls from. <i>Hull</i> the berries.
husk	Remove the husk or husks from. <i>Husk</i> corn.
jet	Fly a jet plane. Flames were <b>jet</b> ting out of the building.
kettle	The quantity a kettle will hold. Activists in the <b>kettle</b> were protesting at being held and resisting arrest.
larder	A small storeroom for storing foods or wines.
pantry	A small storeroom for storing foods or wines.
passenger	A member of a team or group who does far less effective work than the other members. He had been a superlative teacher but his health was gone and he was now a <b>passenger</b> .
peel	Come off in flakes or thin small pieces. The walls are <b>peel</b> ing.
refrigeration	The process of subjecting food or drink to cold in order to chill or preserve it. <b>Refrigeration</b> by immersing the patient s body in a cold bath.



refrigerator	An appliance or compartment which is artificially kept cool and used to store food and drink Modern refrigerators generally make use of the cooling effect produced when a volatile liquid is forced to evaporate in a sealed system in which it can be condensed back to liquid outside the refrigerator.
room	Provide with a shared room or lodging. <i>He wandered from <b>room</b> to <b>room</b>.</i>
<u>sofa</u>	An upholstered seat for more than one person. <b>Sofa</b> cushions.
station	A bus or coach station. The train pulled into the <b>station</b> .
terminal	Of or forming a transport terminal. An industry in <b>terminal</b> decline.
transport	The action of transporting something or the state of being transported. <i>She was transported with pleasure.</i>
