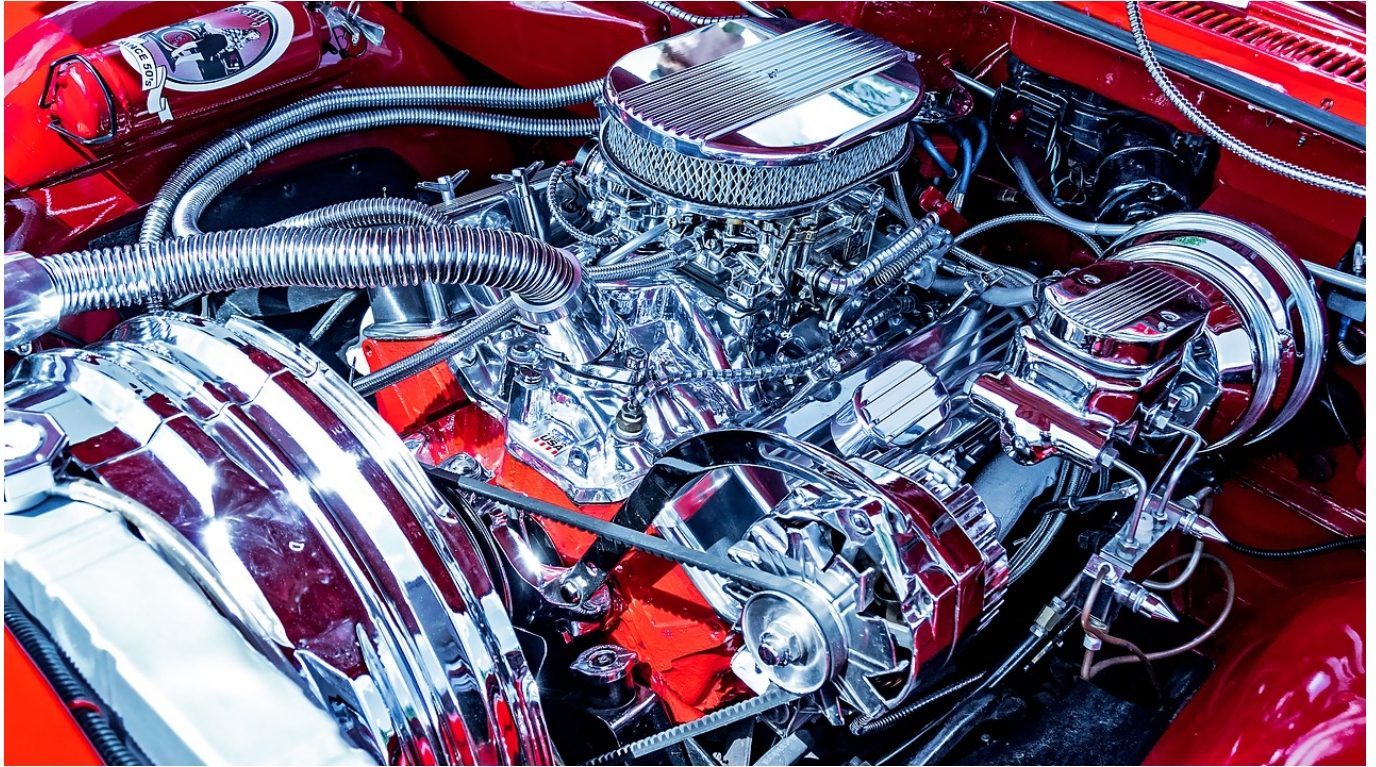

- *An area in which something can be considered in isolation from other things.*
- *A partitioned section, chamber, or separate room within a larger enclosed area.*
- *A grassy mound or other support depicted below a shield.*
- *A division of a railway carriage marked by partitions.*
- *A division of a ship's hull.*

nook	A sheltered and secluded place. <i>The nook beside the fire.</i>
part	A line of scalp revealed in a person's hair by combing the hair away in opposite directions on either side a parting. <i>She was memorizing a part.</i>
partition	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. <i>Partition chromatography.</i>
<u>realm</u>	A domain in which something is dominant. <i>The realm of applied chemistry.</i>
recess	A small concavity. <i>Talks resumed after a month's recess.</i>
<u>section</u>	Any of the more or less distinct parts into which something is or may be divided or from which it is made up. <i>The brass section.</i>
<u>sector</u>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>Operations in the southern sector of the North Sea.</i>
sphere	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>The markers on the route included two conspicuous black spheres.</i>

Synonyms of "Compartment" as a verb (11 Words)

break up	Become punctured or penetrated.
carve up	Form by carving.
cut up	Form by probing, penetrating, or digging.
dismember	Divide into pieces. <i>The tiger dismembered the tourist.</i>
<u>divide</u>	Make a division or separation. <i>Can you divide 49 by seven.</i>
divide up	Perform a division.
separate	Separate into parts or portions. <i>The two pieces that we had glued separated.</i>
slice up	Hit a ball so that it causes a backspin.
<u>split</u>	(of an issue) cause (a group) to be divided because of opposing views. <i>The river had split into a number of channels.</i>
split up	Go one's own way; move apart.
subdivide	Form into subdivisions. <i>The heading was subdivided into eight separate sections.</i>

- *The buildings are to be compartmented by fire walls.*



Associations of "Compartment" (30 Words)

airliner	A large passenger aircraft.
<u>ballast</u>	Make steady with a ballast. <i>The track was laid with rails and ballasted with earth.</i>
bulkhead	A dividing wall or barrier between separate compartments inside a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle.
cupboard	A recess or piece of furniture with a door and typically shelves, used for storage. <i>A broom cupboard.</i>
debark	Leave a ship or aircraft. <i>The ship would simply sail into the harbour dock and begin debarking troops.</i>
deck	A floor of a double decker bus. <i>He stood on the deck of his flagship.</i>

defrost	Remove frost or ice from (the windscreen of a motor vehicle). <i>Defrost the turkey slowly.</i>
disembark	Go ashore. <i>The passengers began to disembark.</i>
disembarkation	The act of passengers and crew getting off of a ship or aircraft.
dishwasher	A machine for washing dishes.
dock	Come into dock. <i>Dock the ships.</i>
embarkation	The act of passengers and crew getting aboard a ship or aircraft.
expeditionary	Of or forming an expedition, especially a military expedition. <i>The French expeditionary force in Indochina.</i>
freezer	Electric refrigerator (trade name Deepfreeze) in which food is frozen and stored for long periods of time. <i>There are some steaks in the freezer.</i>
fridge	A refrigerator in which the coolant is pumped around by an electric motor. <i>She put the carton of milk back in the fridge.</i>
hull	Remove the hulls from. <i>Hull the berries.</i>
husk	Remove the husk or husks from. <i>Husk corn.</i>
jet	Fly a jet plane. <i>Flames were jetting out of the building.</i>
kettle	The quantity a kettle will hold. <i>Activists in the kettle were protesting at being held and resisting arrest.</i>
larder	A small storeroom for storing foods or wines.
pantry	A small storeroom for storing foods or wines.
passenger	A member of a team or group who does far less effective work than the other members. <i>He had been a superlative teacher but his health was gone and he was now a passenger.</i>
peel	Come off in flakes or thin small pieces. <i>The walls are peeling.</i>
refrigeration	The process of subjecting food or drink to cold in order to chill or preserve it. <i>Refrigeration by immersing the patient s body in a cold bath.</i>

refrigerator

An appliance or compartment which is artificially kept cool and used to store food and drink. Modern refrigerators generally make use of the cooling effect produced when a volatile liquid is forced to evaporate in a sealed system in which it can be condensed back to liquid outside the refrigerator.

room

Provide with a shared room or lodging.
*He wandered from **room** to **room**.*

sofa

An upholstered seat for more than one person.
***Sofa** cushions.*

station

A bus or coach station.
*The train pulled into the **station**.*

terminal

Of or forming a transport terminal.
*An industry in **terminal** decline.*

transport

The action of transporting something or the state of being transported.
*She was **transported** with pleasure.*
