beau	A boyfriend or male admirer.
bigamy	The offence of marrying someone while already married to another person.
colleague	A person with whom one works in a profession or business. <i>The surgeon consulted his colleagues.</i>
companion	Be a companion to somebody. <i>She brought along her companion whose drab attire set off her employer's brilliance.</i>
comrade	(among men) a colleague or a fellow member of an organization. <i>You're right comrade.</i>
comradeship	The quality of affording easy familiarity and sociability. <i>His greatest joy came from comradeship with others in the team.</i>
consort	A family of similar musical instrument playing together. <i>You chose to consort with the enemy.</i>
countryman	A man living or born in a rural area. <i>He was a complete countryman with a pronounced affinity with nature.</i>
darling	A person who is particularly popular with a certain group. <i>He's such a darling.</i>
dear	Dearly loved. <i>Five pounds that's a bit dear.</i>
estranged	(of a wife or husband) no longer living with their spouse. <i>His estranged wife.</i>
ex	Out of fashion. <i>All his exes live in Texas.</i>
fellow	A friend who is frequently in the company of another. <i>A tutorial fellow.</i>
folk	Relating to folk music. <i>A mixture of folk and reggae.</i>

friend	Befriend someone. <i>The woman got married and you still used to friend with she.</i>
friendship	The state of being friends (or friendly). <i>She formed close friendships with women.</i>
husband	A married man; a woman's partner in marriage. <i>She and her husband are both retired.</i>
lad	A male child (a familiar term of address to a boy). <i>It s great for the lads that the horse has won the National.</i>
married	A person who is married. <i>In the seventeenth century science was still married to religion.</i>
mate	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>A male bird sings to court a mate.</i>
morganatic	Relating to or denoting a marriage in which neither the spouse of lower rank, nor any children, have any claim to the possessions or title of the spouse of higher rank. <i>He contracted a morganatic marriage with a German born actress.</i>
newlywed	Someone recently married.
pal	Used as a form of address, especially to indicate anger or aggression. <i>Back off pal.</i>
paramour	A lover, especially the illicit partner of a married person.
partner	Provide with a partner. <i>Astaire partnered Rogers.</i>
peer	A nobleman duke or marquis or earl or viscount or baron who is a member of the British peerage. <i>We peered into the back of the shop to see whether a salesman was around.</i>
polygamy	The practice or custom of having more than one wife or husband at the same time.
spouse	A person's partner in marriage.
wife	The wife of a person with a specified occupation. <i>A clergy wife.</i>
workmate	A fellow worker.
