## Associations of "Compelled" (30 Words)

<a href="#">coerce</a>	To cause to do through pressure or necessity, by physical, moral or intellectual means. <i>Their confessions were allegedly <b>coerced</b> by torture.</i>
<a href="#">compelling</a>	Tending to persuade by forcefulness of argument. <i>The temptation to give up was <b>compelling</b>.</i>
<a href="#">compulsory</a>	Required by rule. <i><b>Compulsory</b> military service.</i>
<b>constrain</b>	Severely restrict in scope or extent. <i>Agricultural development is considerably <b>constrained</b> by climate.</i>
<b>demand</b>	The act of demanding. <i>He s got enough <b>demands</b> on his time already.</i>
<b>enforced</b>	Caused by necessity or force; compulsory. <i><b>Enforced</b> obedience.</i>
<b>essential</b>	Absolutely necessary; vitally necessary. <i>Funds <b>essential</b> to the completion of the project.</i>
<b>force</b>	Make a way through or into by physical strength break open by force. <i>The shortstop got the runner at second on a <b>force</b>.</i>
<b>forced</b>	Forced or compelled. <i>A <b>forced</b> smile.</i>
<b>impel</b>	Drive forward; propel. <i>A lack of equality <b>impelled</b> the oppressed to fight.</i>
<b>indispensability</b>	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<a href="#">indispensable</a>	Absolutely necessary; vitally necessary. <i>He made himself <b>indispensable</b> to the parish priest.</i>
<a href="#">integral</a>	The result of a mathematical integration $F x$ is the integral of $f x$ if $dF dx = f x$ . <i>A local motion keepeth bodies <b>integral</b>.</i>

<b>mandatory</b>	The recipient of a mandate. <i>Attendance is <b>mandatory</b>.</i>
<b><u>must</u></b>	The quality of smelling or tasting old or stale or mouldy. <i>Seat belts are an absolute <b>must</b>.</i>
<b>necessary</b>	Needed to be done, achieved, or present; essential. <i>See when they need a tactful word of advice and do the <b>necessary</b>.</i>
<b>necessity</b>	A condition that cannot be otherwise, or a statement asserting this. <i>A good book is a <b>necessity</b> when travelling.</i>
<b>need</b>	Have need of. <i><b>Need</b> I say more.</i>
<b>needs</b>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>
<b>obligate</b>	Require or compel (someone) to undertake a legal or moral duty. <i>The medical establishment is <b>obligated</b> to take action in the best interest of the public.</i>
<b>obligatory</b>	Morally or legally constraining or binding. <i>Attendance is <b>obligatory</b>.</i>
<b>oblige</b>	Bind (someone) by an oath, promise, or contract. <i>If you can give me a few minutes of your time I ll be much <b>obliged</b>.</i>
<b>priesthood</b>	Priests in general. <i>There was relief among the Anglican <b>priesthood</b>.</i>
<b>request</b>	The verbal act of requesting. <i>I <b>requested</b> that she type the entire manuscript.</i>
<b>require</b>	Require as useful just or proper. <i>The minimum car insurance <b>required</b> by law.</i>
<b>required</b>	Required by rule. <i>The corset the garment that ensured the <b>required</b> female shape.</i>
<b>requisite</b>	A thing that is necessary for the achievement of a specified end. <i>The application will not be processed until the <b>requisite</b> fee is paid.</i>
<b><u>unavoidable</u></b>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>The natural and <b>unavoidable</b> consequences of growing old.</i>
<b>unconditionally</b>	In an unqualified manner. <i>To be loved <b>unconditionally</b> is to be loved for who we are.</i>
<b><u>vital</u></b>	Full of spirit; full of life. <i>Blood and other <b>vital</b> fluids.</i>
