| coerce | To cause to do through pressure or necessity, by physical, moral or intellectual means. <i>Their confessions were allegedly coerced by torture.</i> |
| compelling | Tending to persuade by forcefulness of argument. <i>The temptation to give up was compelling.</i> |
| compulsory | Required by rule. <i>Compulsory military service.</i> |
| constrain | Severely restrict in scope or extent. <i>Agricultural development is considerably constrained by climate.</i> |
| demand | The act of demanding. <i>He s got enough demands on his time already.</i> |
| enforced | Caused by necessity or force; compulsory. <i>Enforced obedience.</i> |
| essential | Absolutely necessary; vitally necessary. <i>Funds essential to the completion of the project.</i> |
| force | Make a way through or into by physical strength break open by force. <i>The shortstop got the runner at second on a force.</i> |
| forced | Forced or compelled. <i>A forced smile.</i> |
| impel | Drive forward; propel. <i>A lack of equality impelled the oppressed to fight.</i> |
| indispensability | The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without. |
| indispensable | Absolutely necessary; vitally necessary. <i>He made himself indispensable to the parish priest.</i> |
| integral | The result of a mathematical integration $F x$ is the integral of $f x$ if $dF dx = f x$. <i>A local motion keepeth bodies integral.</i> |

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| mandatory | The recipient of a mandate. <i>Attendance is mandatory.</i> |
| must | The quality of smelling or tasting old or stale or mouldy. <i>Seat belts are an absolute must.</i> |
| necessary | Needed to be done, achieved, or present; essential. <i>See when they need a tactful word of advice and do the necessary.</i> |
| necessity | A condition that cannot be otherwise, or a statement asserting this. <i>A good book is a necessity when travelling.</i> |
| need | Have need of. <i>Need I say more.</i> |
| needs | In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must needs by objective.</i> |
| obligate | Require or compel (someone) to undertake a legal or moral duty. <i>The medical establishment is obligated to take action in the best interest of the public.</i> |
| obligatory | Morally or legally constraining or binding. <i>Attendance is obligatory.</i> |
| oblige | Bind (someone) by an oath, promise, or contract. <i>If you can give me a few minutes of your time I ll be much obliged.</i> |
| priesthood | Priests in general. <i>There was relief among the Anglican priesthood.</i> |
| request | The verbal act of requesting. <i>I requested that she type the entire manuscript.</i> |
| require | Require as useful just or proper. <i>The minimum car insurance required by law.</i> |
| required | Required by rule. <i>The corset the garment that ensured the required female shape.</i> |
| requisite | A thing that is necessary for the achievement of a specified end. <i>The application will not be processed until the requisite fee is paid.</i> |
| unavoidable | Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>The natural and unavoidable consequences of growing old.</i> |
| unconditionally | In an unqualified manner. <i>To be loved unconditionally is to be loved for who we are.</i> |
| vital | Full of spirit; full of life. <i>Blood and other vital fluids.</i> |
