<b>self-complacency</b>	The feeling you have when you are satisfied with yourself.
<b>self-regard</b>	The quality of being worthy of esteem or respect.
<b>self-satisfaction</b>	The feeling you have when you are satisfied with yourself.
<b>smugness</b>	Excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements. <i>The <b>smugness</b> of a man basking too long in critical ardour.</i>

- *His complacency was absolutely disgusting.*

<b>bliss</b>	A state of spiritual blessedness, typically that reached after death. <i>Josh is just <b>blissed</b> out always smiling.</i>
<b>complacent</b>	Contented to a fault with oneself or one's actions. <i>He had become <b>complacent</b> after years of success.</i>
<b>content</b>	Make content. <i>I am <b>contented</b>.</i>
<b>contented</b>	Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are. <i>I felt warm and <b>contented</b>.</i>
<b>contentment</b>	Happiness with one's situation in life. <i>He found <b>contentment</b> in living a simple life in the country.</i>
<b>delectation</b>	A feeling of extreme pleasure or satisfaction. <i>They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our <b>delectation</b>.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The company was <b>enjoyable</b>.</i>
<b>exult</b>	Feel or show triumphant elation or jubilation. <i><b>Exulting</b> in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>glad</b>	Causing happiness. <i>He was <b>glad</b> that Phyllis was gone.</i>
<b>gratification</b>	The act or an instance of satisfying. <i>A thirst for sexual <b>gratification</b>.</i>
<b>happiness</b>	The state of being happy. <i>She struggled to find <b>happiness</b> in her life.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Willing to do something. <i>A <b>happy</b> outcome.</i>
<b>idleness</b>	The quality of lacking substance or value. <i>He was punished for his <b>idleness</b> at school.</i>
<b>inactivity</b>	The state of being inactive. <i>Don t suddenly take up violent exercise after years of <b>inactivity</b>.</i>
<b>joviality</b>	A jovial nature.
<b>laughing</b>	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i><b>Laughing</b> children.</i>
<b>lull</b>	Calm by deception. <i>Don t let yourself be <b>lulled</b> into a false state of security.</i>

<b><u>motionless</u></b>	Not moving; stationary. <i>An eagle hung almost <b>motionless</b> close to the ground.</i>
<b>peace</b>	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>Police action to restore <b>peace</b>.</i>
<b><u>pleased</u></b>	Proud of one's achievements, especially excessively so; self-satisfied. <i>Both girls were <b>pleased</b> with their new hairstyles.</i>
<b>quiescence</b>	Inactivity or dormancy. <i>This method has been shown to induce sleep like <b>quiescence</b> in adult animals.</i>
<b>quiescent</b>	Causing no symptoms. <i>The <b>quiescent</b> melancholy of the town.</i>
<b>quietly</b>	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>The rock star was <b>quietly</b> led out the back door.</i>
<b>satisfaction</b>	State of being gratified or satisfied. <i>I demand the <b>satisfaction</b> of a gentleman.</i>
<b>satisfactorily</b>	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. <i>The plan has not worked <b>satisfactorily</b>.</i>
<b><u>satisfied</u></b>	Filled with satisfaction. <i><b>Satisfied</b> customers.</i>
<b><u>stationary</u></b>	Standing still. <i>A car collided with a <b>stationary</b> vehicle.</i>
<b>still</b>	A plant and works where alcoholic drinks are made by distillation. <i>He couldn't hold <b>still</b> any longer.</i>
<b>tranquilize</b>	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
