
Complacency as a Noun

self-regard The quality of being worthy of esteem or respect.

self-satisfaction The feeling you have when you are satisfied with yourself.

Excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements.

smugness
The smugness of a man basking too long in critical ardour.

- His complacency was absolutely disgusting.

Happiness with one's situation in life. **contentment**

A feeling of extreme pleasure or satisfaction. delectation

He was **glad** that Phyllis was gone.

The act or an instance of satisfying. gratification

A thirst for sexual **gratification**.

The state of being happy. **happiness**

She struggled to find **happiness** in her life.

Willing to do something. happy

A happy outcome.

The quality of lacking substance or value. idleness

He was punished for his **idleness** at school.

The state of being inactive. inactivity

Don t suddenly take up violent exercise after years of **inactivity**.

A jovial nature. joviality

Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. laughing

Laughing children.

Calm by deception. lull

Don t let yourself be **lull**ed into a false state of security.



motionless Not moving; stationary.

An eagle hung almost **motionless** close to the ground.

peace A treaty agreeing peace between warring states.

Police action to restore **peace**.

Proud of one's achievements, especially excessively so; self-satisfied.

Both girls were **pleased** with their new hairstyles.

Inactivity or dormancy.

quiescence This method has been shown to induce sleep like **quiescence** in adult

animals.

quiescent Causing no symptoms.

The **quiescent** melancholy of the town.

With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for

quietly quietly.

The rock star was **quietly** led out the back door.

satisfaction State of being gratified or satisfied.

I demand the **satisfaction** of a gentleman.

In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably.

satisfactorily The plan has not worked satisfactorily.

satisfied Filled with satisfaction.

Satisfied customers.

stationary Standing still.

A car collided with a **stationary** vehicle.

still A plant and works where alcoholic drinks are made by distillation.

He couldn t hold **still** any longer.

tranquilize Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
