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## Associations of "Complained" (30 Words)

<b>cry</b>	Bring into a particular state by crying. <i>A <b>cry</b> to arms.</i>
<b>cynic</b>	Someone who is critical of the motives of others. <i>Some <b>cynics</b> thought that the controversy was all a publicity stunt.</i>
<b>discontented</b>	Dissatisfied, especially with one’s circumstances. <i>Strikes by <b>discontented</b> workers.</i>
<b>disgruntled</b>	In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i>Judges receive letters from <b>disgruntled</b> members of the public.</i>
<b>disobedience</b>	Failure or refusal to obey rules or someone in authority. <i><b>Disobedience</b> to law is sometimes justified.</i>
<b>dissatisfied</b>	Not content or happy with something. <i><b>Dissatisfied</b> customers.</i>
<b>dissatisfy</b>	Fail to satisfy (someone). <i>What is it about these words that dissatisfies you?</i>
<b>gripe</b>	Secure a boat with gripes. <i>Hilyard <b>griped</b> his dagger.</i>
<b>grouch</b>	Voice one’s discontent ill-temperedly; grumble. <i>He s in a thundering <b>grouch</b>.</i>
<b>grouse</b>	Flesh of any of various grouse of the family Tetraonidae usually roasted flesh too dry to broil.
<b>growl</b>	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>Keep out of this he <b>growled</b>.</i>
<b>grumble</b>	Make a low rumbling sound. <i>I m getting old she <b>grumbled</b>.</i>
<b>holler</b>	A loud cry or shout. <i>He <b>hollered</b> out to surrender our weapons.</i>

<b><u>howl</u></b>	Make a howling sound. <i>They listened to the <b>howl</b> of the gale.</i>
<b>ingratitude</b>	A discreditable lack of gratitude. <i>He returned his daughter's care with <b>ingratitude</b> and unkindness.</i>
<b>malcontent</b>	A person who is dissatisfied and rebellious. <i>It was too late to stop the <b>malcontents</b> with a show of force.</i>
<b><u>mutter</u></b>	Talk indistinctly; usually in a low voice. <i>He <b>muttered</b> something under his breath.</i>
<b>muttering</b>	A low continuous indistinct sound; often accompanied by movement of the lips without the production of articulate speech. <i>There were disloyal <b>mutterings</b> about his leadership.</i>
<b><u>rant</u></b>	A spell of ranting a tirade. <i>His <b>rants</b> against organized religion.</i>
<b><u>rumble</u></b>	A loud low dull continuous noise. <i>There were of <b>rumbles</b> of discontent from small retailers.</i>
<b>screech</b>	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>The van <b>screeched</b> round a bend at speed.</i>
<b>shriek</b>	Sharp piercing cry. <i>The answer <b>shrieked</b> at her all too clearly.</i>
<b>sniffle</b>	An act or sound of sniffing. <i>She had a slight cough and a <b>sniffle</b>.</i>
<b>snivel</b>	An act or sound of snivelling. <i>He shouldn't <b>snivel</b> about his punishment.</i>
<b>squawk</b>	The noise of squawking. <i>She awoke to the <b>squawk</b> of chickens.</i>
<b><u>squeal</u></b>	Make a squeal. <i>She feared they would victimize her for <b>squealing</b> on their pals.</i>
<b>wail</b>	Utter a wail. <i>The <b>wail</b> of an air raid siren.</i>
<b><u>whimper</u></b>	A whimpering sound. <i>She gave a little <b>whimper</b> of protest.</i>
<b>whine</b>	A complaining tone of voice. <i>The dog gave a small <b>whine</b>.</i>
<b><u>yell</u></b>	Utter or declare in a very loud voice. <i>Her foot slipped and she gave a <b>yell</b> of fear.</i>
