Associations of "Complained" (30 Words)

cry	Bring into a particular state by crying. <i>A cry to arms.</i>
cynic	Someone who is critical of the motives of others. <i>Some cynics thought that the controversy was all a publicity stunt.</i>
discontented	Dissatisfied, especially with one’s circumstances. <i>Strikes by discontented workers.</i>
disgruntled	In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i>Judges receive letters from disgruntled members of the public.</i>
disobedience	Failure or refusal to obey rules or someone in authority. <i>Disobedience to law is sometimes justified.</i>
dissatisfied	Not content or happy with something. <i>Dissatisfied customers.</i>
dissatisfy	Fail to satisfy (someone). <i>What is it about these words that dissatisfies you?</i>
gripe	Secure a boat with gripes. <i>Hilyard griped his dagger.</i>
grouch	Voice one’s discontent ill-temperedly; grumble. <i>He s in a thundering grouch.</i>
grouse	Flesh of any of various grouse of the family Tetraonidae usually roasted flesh too dry to broil.
growl	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>Keep out of this he growled.</i>
grumble	Make a low rumbling sound. <i>I m getting old she grumbled.</i>
holler	A loud cry or shout. <i>He hollered out to surrender our weapons.</i>

<u>howl</u>	Make a howling sound. <i>They listened to the howl of the gale.</i>
ingratitude	A discreditable lack of gratitude. <i>He returned his daughter's care with ingratitude and unkindness.</i>
malcontent	A person who is dissatisfied and rebellious. <i>It was too late to stop the malcontents with a show of force.</i>
<u>mutter</u>	Talk indistinctly; usually in a low voice. <i>He muttered something under his breath.</i>
muttering	A low continuous indistinct sound; often accompanied by movement of the lips without the production of articulate speech. <i>There were disloyal mutterings about his leadership.</i>
<u>rant</u>	A spell of ranting a tirade. <i>His rants against organized religion.</i>
<u>rumble</u>	A loud low dull continuous noise. <i>There were of rumbles of discontent from small retailers.</i>
screech	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>The van screeched round a bend at speed.</i>
shriek	Sharp piercing cry. <i>The answer shrieked at her all too clearly.</i>
sniffle	An act or sound of sniffing. <i>She had a slight cough and a sniffle.</i>
snivel	An act or sound of snivelling. <i>He shouldn't snivel about his punishment.</i>
squawk	The noise of squawking. <i>She awoke to the squawk of chickens.</i>
<u>squeal</u>	Make a squeal. <i>She feared they would victimize her for squealing on their pals.</i>
wail	Utter a wail. <i>The wail of an air raid siren.</i>
<u>whimper</u>	A whimpering sound. <i>She gave a little whimper of protest.</i>
whine	A complaining tone of voice. <i>The dog gave a small whine.</i>
<u>yell</u>	Utter or declare in a very loud voice. <i>Her foot slipped and she gave a yell of fear.</i>
