## Usage Examples of "Composes" as a verb

- Greed and ambition composed his personality.
- She composed a poem.
- Beethoven composed nine symphonies.
- She had to compose herself before she could reply to this terrible insult.

**ballpoint** A pen that has a small metal ball as the point of transfer of ink to paper.

bard A lyric poet.

Our national **bard** Robert Burns.

A list of writings with time and place of publication (such as the writings of

**bibliography** a single author or the works referred to in preparing a document etc.

A **bibliography** of his publications.

Accumulate (a specified score.

**Compile** a list.

**comprise** Form or compose.

This single breed **comprise**s 50 per cent of the Swiss cattle population.

**constitute** Be (a part) of a whole.

The superior courts were **constitute**d by the Judicature Acts 1873 5.



A collection of papers containing detailed information about a particular

**dossier** person or subject (usually a person's record.

We have a **dossier** on him.

**extempore** Without prior preparation.

Perform without preparation.

extemporize

He extemporized a speech at the wedding.

harmonize Write a harmony for.

The colors don t **harmonize**.

An **extempore** skit.

immediate Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect.

His **immediate** superior in the department.

A short musical passage that seems to have been made spontaneously

**impromptu** without advance preparation.

A witty **impromptu** must not sound premeditated.

Perform without preparation.

improvise

He invited actors to improvise dialogue.

improvised Created and performed spontaneously or without preparation; impromptu.

An **improvised** short speech.

indite Produce a literary work.

He **indite**s the wondrous tale of Our Lord.

instantly At once; immediately.

She fell asleep almost **instantly**.

makeup Cosmetics applied to the face to improve or change your appearance.

He missed the test and had to take a **makeup**.

Music the sounds produced by singers or musical instruments or

**music** reproductions of such sounds.

Baroque **music**.

notebook

A small book with blank or ruled pages for writing notes in.

He copied the number into his **notebook**.

offhand Without previous thought or preparation.

We decided **offhand** to go to Canada.

opus A musical work that has been created.

He was writing an **opus** on Mexico.

Addressing an audience formally (usually a long and rhetorical address

**oratory** and often pompous.

He loved the sound of his own **oratory**.



orchestrate Plan and direct (a complex undertaking.

The situation has been **orchestrate**d by a tiny minority.

Arrange by systematic planning and united effort.

The soul doth **organize** the body.

An electronic device like a pen used in conjunction with a writing surface

**pen** to enter commands or data into a computer.

*She was forced to support herself by the pen.* 

A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry.

He is more **poet** than academic because of his gift for language.

**priesthood** Priests in general.

There was relief among the Anglican **priesthood**.

song

A musical composition suggestive of a song.

The pilgrims broke into **song**.

spontaneously Without advance preparation.

Mutations can occur spontaneously.
