<b>composite plant</b>	Considered the most highly evolved dicotyledonous plants, characterized by florets arranged in dense heads that resemble single flowers.
<u><b>compound</b></u>	A word made up of two or more existing words. <i>A <b>compound</b> of hydrogen and oxygen.</i>
<u><b>conglomeration</b></u>	An occurrence combining miscellaneous things into a (more or less) rounded mass. <i>The practice of media <b>conglomeration</b>.</i>
<u><b>fusion</b></u>	A nuclear reaction in which nuclei combine to form more massive nuclei with the simultaneous release of energy. <i>The film showed a perfect <b>fusion</b> of image and sound.</i>
<u><b>meld</b></u>	A thing formed by melding a combination. <i>A <b>meld</b> of many contributions.</i>
<u><b>mixture</b></u>	An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>He drank a <b>mixture</b> of beer and lemonade.</i>
<b>synthesis</b>	Reasoning from the general to the particular (or from cause to effect). <i>The <b>synthesis</b> of methanol from carbon monoxide and hydrogen.</i>

- *Of or relating to or belonging to the plant family Compositae.*

- *(of a constructional material) made up of recognizable constituents.*
- *Made up of several parts or elements.*
- *Relating to or denoting a classical order of architecture consisting of elements of the Ionic and Corinthian orders.*

<b>blend</b>	Blend or harmonize. <i>The colors <b>blend</b> well.</i>
<b>blending</b>	The act of blending components together thoroughly. <i>Clever cultural <b>blendings</b>.</i>
<b>chemically</b>	With chemicals. <i>Drugs and alcohol offered a <b>chemically</b> induced sense of belonging.</i>
<b>combination</b>	A sequence of numbers or letters that opens a combination lock. <i><b>Combination</b> remedies contain painkiller decongestant and cough soother.</i>
<b>complex</b>	Make an atom or compound form a complex with another. <i>A <b>complex</b> of mountain roads.</i>



<b>complexity</b>	The state or quality of being intricate or complicated. <i>An issue of great <b>complexity</b>.</i>
<b><u>complicated</u></b>	Involving complications. <i>A <b>complicated</b> stereo system.</i>
<b><u>compound</u></b>	Composed of more than one part <i>compound flower heads.</i> <i>A blackberry is a <b>compound</b> fruit.</i>
<b>conjugate</b>	A mixture of two partially miscible liquids A and B produces two conjugate solutions one of A in B and another of B in A. <i>Bilirubin is then <b>conjugated</b> by liver enzymes and excreted in the bile.</i>
<b>convoluted</b>	(especially of an argument, story, or sentence) extremely complex and difficult to follow. <i><b>Convoluted</b> reasoning.</i>
<b>epoxy</b>	Glue something using epoxy resin. <i><b>Epoxy</b> the shards.</i>
<b>hybrid</b>	Bred as a hybrid from different species or varieties. <i>The vice presidency is a <b>hybrid</b> of administrative and legislative offices.</i>
<b>intricate</b>	Having many complexly arranged elements; elaborate. <i><b>Intricate</b> lacework.</i>
<b>involution</b>	The shrinkage of an organ in old age or when inactive, e.g. of the uterus after childbirth. <i>Periods of artistic <b>involution</b>.</i>
<b><u>labyrinth</u></b>	A complex structure in the inner ear which contains the organs of hearing and balance It consists of bony cavities the bony labyrinth filled with fluid and lined with sensitive membranes the membranous labyrinth. <i>A <b>labyrinth</b> of conflicting laws and regulations.</i>
<b><u>mingle</u></b>	To bring or combine together or with something else. <i>A smell which <b>mingled</b> disinfectant and soap.</i>
<b>miter</b>	Fit together in a miter joint. <i>He covered the <b>miter</b> with glue before making the joint.</i>
<b>mix</b>	The proportion of different people or other constituents that make up a mixture. <i>These two chemicals when <b>mixed</b> together literally explode.</i>
<b><u>mixture</u></b>	An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>He was a curious <b>mixture</b> an unpredictable man.</i>
<b>molecule</b>	A group of atoms bonded together, representing the smallest fundamental unit of a chemical compound that can take part in a chemical reaction.
<b>nuance</b>	Give nuances to. <i>Without understanding the finer <b>nuances</b> you can't enjoy the humor.</i>
