<b><u>constitute</u></b>	Set up or lay the groundwork for. <i>The superior courts were <b>constituted</b> by the Judicature Acts 1873 5.</i>
<b>contain</b>	Contain or hold have within. <i>The government has already taken steps to <b>contain</b> the disease.</i>
<b>embrace</b>	Accept (a belief, theory, or change) willingly and enthusiastically. <i>Aunt Sophie <b>embraced</b> her warmly.</i>
<b>encompass</b>	Include comprehensively. <i>This group <b>encompasses</b> a wide range of people from different backgrounds.</i>
<b>form</b>	Make or be made into a specific shape or form. <i>The company was <b>formed</b> in 1982.</i>
<b>incorporate</b>	Include or contain; have as a component. <i>She <b>incorporated</b> his suggestions into her proposal.</i>
<b>make up</b>	Create or design, often in a certain way.
<b>represent</b>	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>This sum <b>represents</b> my entire income for a year.</i>
<b>take in</b>	Take into one's possession.

## Usage Examples of "Comprise" as a verb

- *A totally new idea is comprised in this paper.*
- *The land he conquered comprised several provinces.*
- *Documents are comprised of words.*
- *The country comprises twenty states.*

<b><u>implicate</u></b>	Bear some of the responsibility for (an action or process, especially a criminal or harmful one). <i>He <b>implicated</b> his government in the murders of three judges.</i>
<b>include</b>	Have as a part, be made up out of. <i>The list <b>includes</b> the names of many famous writers.</i>
<b>inclusion</b>	A person or thing that is included within a whole. <i>We value and promote diversity and <b>inclusion</b> in every aspect of our business.</i>

<b>inclusive</b>	Aiming to provide equal access to opportunities and resources for people who might otherwise be excluded or marginalized, such as those having physical or mental disabilities or belonging to other minority groups. <i>An <b>inclusive</b> fee.</i>
<b>incorporate</b>	Having a bodily form; embodied. <i>He has <b>incorporated</b> in his proposals a number of measures.</i>
<u><b>involve</b></u>	Require as useful, just, or proper. <i>This decision <b>involves</b> many changes.</i>
<b>makeup</b>	Cosmetics applied to the face to improve or change your appearance. <i>He missed the test and had to take a <b>makeup</b>.</i>
