- *A person who makes calculations, especially with a calculating machine.*
- *A machine for performing calculations automatically.*

A small machine that is used for mathematical calculations.

computing device

The branch of engineering science that studies (with the aid of computers) computable processes and structures.

computing machine

The procedure of calculating; determining something by mathematical or logical methods.

A collection of facts from which conclusions may be drawn.

estimator

A quantity used or evaluated as an estimate of the value of a parameter.

figurer

An expert at calculation (or at operating calculating machines.

information processing system

Knowledge acquired through study or experience or instruction.

reckoner

A table or device designed to assist with calculation.

A small machine that is used for mathematical calculations.

The branch of engineering science that studies (with the aid of computers) computable processes and structures.
*Developments in mathematics and **computing**.*

conductive

Having the property of conducting something (especially heat or electricity).
*A **conductive** material.*

desktop	The working area of a computer screen regarded as a representation of a notional desktop and containing icons representing items such as files. <i>A new low end desktop.</i>
<u>digital</u>	Relating to using or storing data or information in the form of digital signals. <i>A digital recording.</i>
<u>electronic</u>	Of music produced by electronic instruments. <i>Electronic banking.</i>
electronically	In a way that relates to electrons. <i>Molecules that can accept energy to form electronically excited states.</i>
<u>engineering</u>	A field of study or activity concerned with modification or development in a particular area. <i>If not for his shrewd engineering the election would have been lost.</i>
functional	Relating to the way in which something works or operates. <i>A small functional bathroom.</i>
keyboard	Enter data by means of a keyboard. <i>Entries would be keyboarded.</i>
keypad	A miniature keyboard or set of buttons for operating a portable electronic device, telephone, or other equipment.
laptop	A computer that is portable and suitable for use while travelling.
machinery	Machines or machine systems collectively. <i>The complex machinery of negotiation.</i>
<u>mechanical</u>	A manual worker. <i>His smile was very mechanical.</i>
microphone	Device for converting sound waves into electrical energy.
microprocessor	An integrated circuit that contains all the functions of a central processing unit of a computer. <i>A disk drive contains a microprocessor to handle the internal functions of the drive.</i>
modem	Send data by modem. <i>Iva and Bill were modeming new programs to New Orleans.</i>
newfangled	Gratuitously new. <i>Newfangled ideas.</i>
oriented	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The house had its large windows oriented toward the ocean view.</i>

portable	A small transportable building used as a classroom. <i>A portable outboard motor.</i>
<u>programming</u>	The process or activity of writing computer programs. <i>The programming of shows.</i>
<u>robotic</u>	Relating to or of the nature of robots. <i>His robotic voice.</i>
science	A particular area of science. <i>His rare science and his practical skill.</i>
<u>screen</u>	Separate something from something else with or as if with a screen. <i>Services offered by the centre include a health screen for people who have just joined the company.</i>
server	A computer or computer program which manages access to a centralized resource or service in a network. <i>The software runs on a variety of Unix servers.</i>
software	Written programs or procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system and that are stored in read/write memory. <i>The market for software is expected to expand.</i>
technology	The practical application of science to commerce or industry. <i>Advances in computer technology.</i>
wireless	An electronic receiver that detects and demodulates and amplifies transmitted signals. <i>Listening to the news on the wireless.</i>
workstation	An area where work of a particular nature is carried out, such as a specific location on an assembly line.
