
### Conceal as a Verb

### Definitions of "Conceal" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "conceal" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Hold back; keep from being perceived by others.
- Prevent (something) from being known; keep secret.
- Prevent from being seen or discovered.
- Not allow to be seen; hide.





## Synonyms of "Conceal" as a verb (16 Words)

**camouflaged**Disguise by camouflaging; exploit the natural surroundings to disguise

something.

**cover up** Be responsible for reporting the details of, as in journalism.

Make unrecognizable.

Brian was **disguise**d as a priest.

**dissemble** Behave unnaturally or affectedly.

An honest sincere person with no need to **dissemble**.

hide Prevent (someone or something) from being seen.

Herbert could hardly hide his dislike.

**hold back** To close within bounds limit or hold back from movement.

hold in Support or hold in a certain manner.keep hidden Conform one's action or practice to.

keep out of sight Maintain in safety from injury, harm, or danger.

mask Cover the face with a mask.

The herb **mask**s the garlic taste.

**obscured** Make less visible or unclear.



out of sight Reveal (something) about somebody's identity or lifestyle. screened Test or examine for the presence of disease or infection.

Generate and separate from cells or bodily fluids. secrete

The money was **secrete**d from his children.

Draw together into folds or puckers. tuck away

Cover with a veil. **veil** 

Women in Afghanistan veil their faces.

**Interment** The ritual placing of a corpse in a grave.

A large burial chamber, usually above ground.
