faun	One of a class of lustful rural gods, represented as a man with a goat's horns, ears, legs, and tail.
idea	Melodic subject of a musical composition. The accompanist picked up the <b>idea</b> and elaborated it.
ideational	Being of the nature of a notion or concept. Policy has been shaped by both material and <b>ideational</b> factors.
<u>image</u>	Language used in a figurative or nonliteral sense. He provided America with an <b>image</b> of the good father.
<u>imagery</u>	The ability to form mental images of things or events. <i>Tennyson uses</i> <b>imagery</b> to create a lyrical emotion.
