**conceptuality** An elaborated concept.

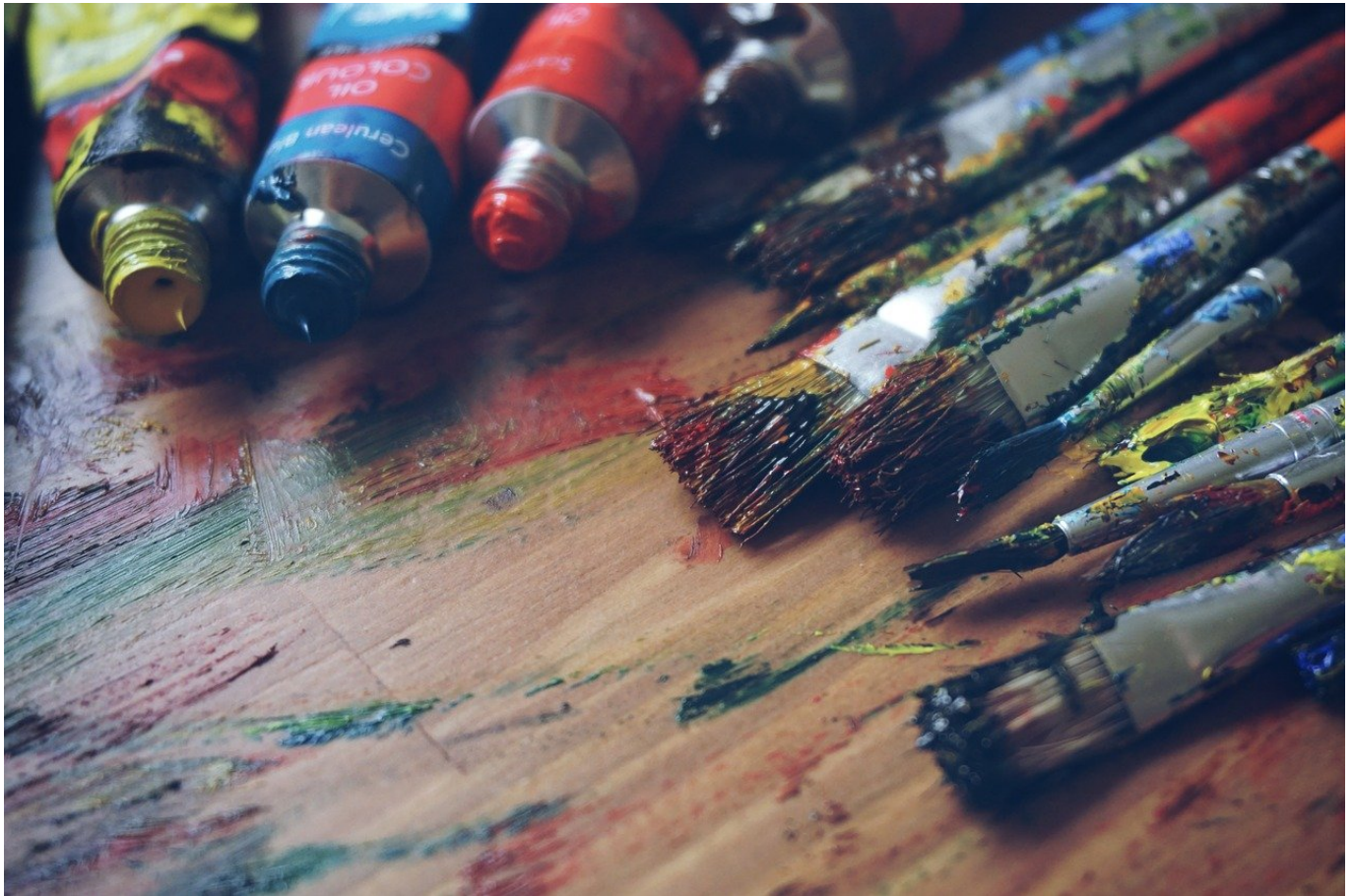
**formulation** A particular expression of an idea, thought, or theory.

### abstract

### awareness

Concern about and well-informed interest in a particular situation or development.

*There is a lack of **awareness** of the risks.*

### cognition

A perception sensation idea or intuition resulting from the process of cognition.

### cognitive

Relating to cognition.

*The **cognitive** processes involved in reading.*

### conceivable

Capable of being imagined.

*The body was photographed from every **conceivable** angle.*

### conceive

(of a woman) become pregnant.

*The racist **conceives** such people to be inferior.*

<b>conception</b>	Ability to imagine; understanding. <i>The time between a product's <b>conception</b> and its launch.</i>
<b>creative</b>	A person whose job involves creative work. <i><b>Creative</b> writing.</i>
<b>espy</b>	Catch sight of. <i>She <b>espied</b> her daughter rounding the corner.</i>
<b>fantasy</b>	The faculty or activity of imagining impossible or improbable things. <i>It is a misleading <b>fantasy</b> to suggest that the bill can be implemented.</i>
<b>idealize</b>	Consider or render as ideal. <i>We <b>idealize</b> the life of a student.</i>
<b>ideational</b>	Being of the nature of a notion or concept. <i>Policy has been shaped by both material and <b>ideational</b> factors.</i>
<b>imaginable</b>	Capable of being imagined. <i>The most spectacular views <b>imaginable</b>.</i>
<b>imagine</b>	Suppose or assume. <i>I <b>imagine</b> she earned a lot of money with her new novel.</i>
<b>intangibility</b>	The quality of being intangible and not perceptible by touch. Profound scholarly knowledge.
<b>learning</b>	<i>The <b>learnings</b> from the mission will help NASA plan for a future mission to Mars.</i>
<b>mental</b>	Of or relating to the mind. <i>A <b>mental</b> illness.</i>
<b>mindset</b>	The established set of attitudes held by someone. <i>The region seems stuck in a medieval <b>mindset</b>.</i>
<b>objectify</b>	Make impersonal or present as an object. <i>Good poetry <b>objectifies</b> feeling.</i>
<b>parapsychology</b>	Phenomena that appear to contradict physical laws and suggest the possibility of causation by mental processes.
<b>psychological</b>	Relating to psychology. <i>Give <b>psychological</b> support.</i>
<b>psychology</b>	The science of mental life. <i>The <b>psychology</b> of child killers.</i>
<b>psychotherapy</b>	The branch of psychiatry concerned with psychological methods.
<b>semiconscious</b>	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.
<b>sensibility</b>	Responsiveness to external stimuli; the faculty of sensation. <i>Cruelty offended his <b>sensibility</b>.</i>

<b><u>sentiment</u></b>	The expression of a view or desire especially as formulated for a toast. <i>An intense <b>sentiment</b> of horror.</i>
<b>superego</b>	(psychoanalysis) that part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>The father is the model for the <b>superego</b>.</i>
<b>think</b>	An instance of deliberate thinking. <i>What do you <b>think</b> you re doing.</i>
<b>thinking</b>	Using thought or rational judgement; intelligent. <i>I am wrap d in dismal <b>thinkings</b>.</i>
<b>understand</b>	Be understanding of. <i>I <b>understand</b> you have no previous experience.</i>
