conceptualisation An elaborated concept.

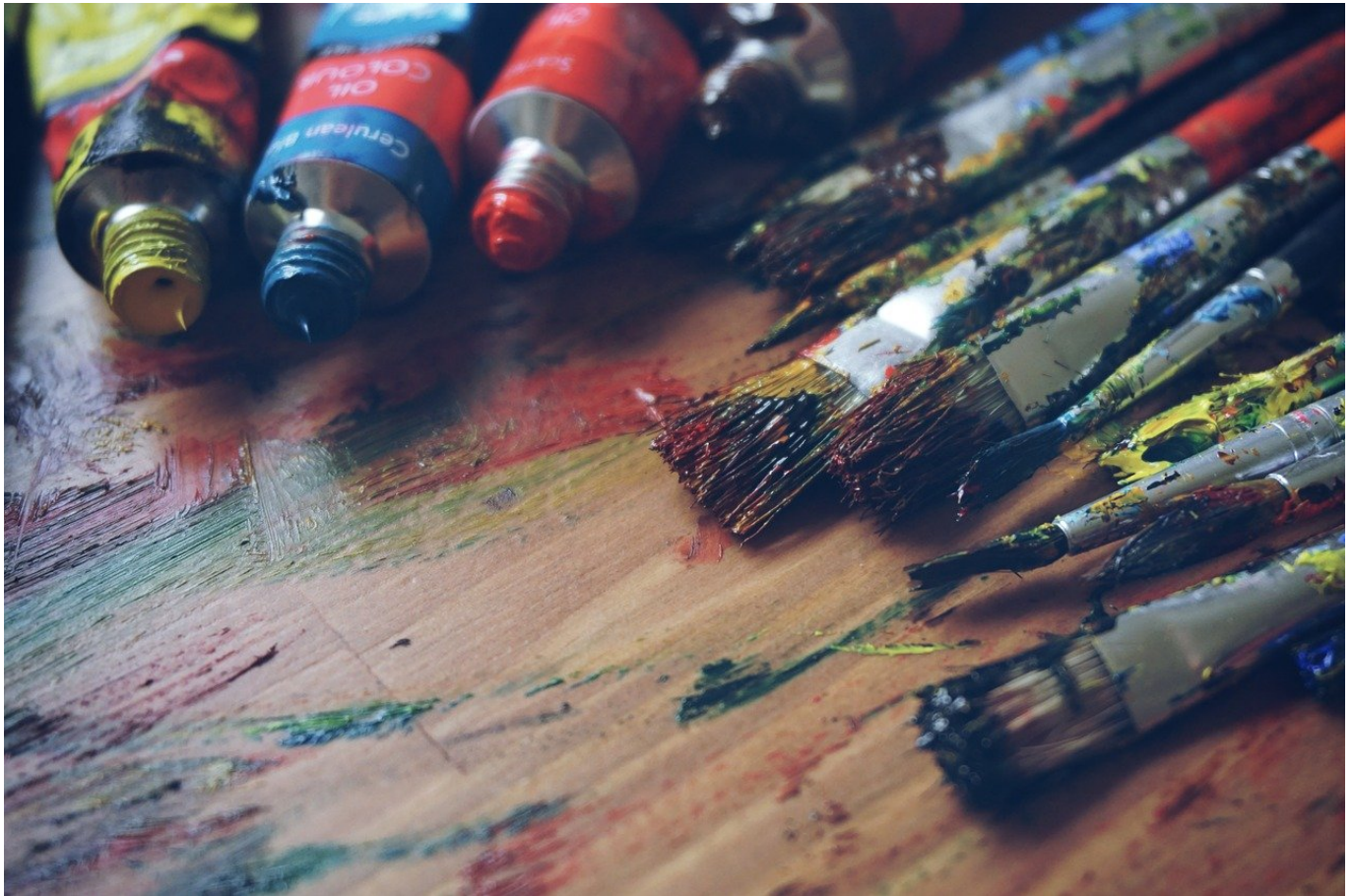
conceptuality An elaborated concept.

abstract

An abstract work of art.

*As our relationship deepened you seemed to **abstract** yourself.*

awareness

Concern about and well-informed interest in a particular situation or development.

*There is a lack of **awareness** of the risks.*

cognition

A perception sensation idea or intuition resulting from the process of cognition.

cognitive

Relating to cognition.

*The **cognitive** processes involved in reading.*

conceivable

Capable of being imagined.

*The body was photographed from every **conceivable** angle.*

conceive

(of a woman) become pregnant.

*The racist **conceives** such people to be inferior.*

conception	Ability to imagine; understanding. <i>The time between a product's conception and its launch.</i>
creative	A person whose job involves creative work. <i>Creative writing.</i>
espy	Catch sight of. <i>She espied her daughter rounding the corner.</i>
fantasy	The faculty or activity of imagining impossible or improbable things. <i>It is a misleading fantasy to suggest that the bill can be implemented.</i>
idealize	Consider or render as ideal. <i>We idealize the life of a student.</i>
ideational	Being of the nature of a notion or concept. <i>Policy has been shaped by both material and ideational factors.</i>
imaginable	Capable of being imagined. <i>The most spectacular views imaginable.</i>
imagine	Suppose or assume. <i>I imagine she earned a lot of money with her new novel.</i>
intangibility	The quality of being intangible and not perceptible by touch. Profound scholarly knowledge.
learning	<i>The learnings from the mission will help NASA plan for a future mission to Mars.</i>
mental	Of or relating to the mind. <i>A mental illness.</i>
mindset	The established set of attitudes held by someone. <i>The region seems stuck in a medieval mindset.</i>
objectify	Make impersonal or present as an object. <i>Good poetry objectifies feeling.</i>
parapsychology	Phenomena that appear to contradict physical laws and suggest the possibility of causation by mental processes.
psychological	Relating to psychology. <i>Give psychological support.</i>
psychology	The science of mental life. <i>The psychology of child killers.</i>
psychotherapy	The branch of psychiatry concerned with psychological methods.
semiconscious	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.
sensibility	Responsiveness to external stimuli; the faculty of sensation. <i>Cruelty offended his sensibility.</i>

<u>sentiment</u>	The expression of a view or desire especially as formulated for a toast. <i>An intense sentiment of horror.</i>
superego	(psychoanalysis) that part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>The father is the model for the superego.</i>
think	An instance of deliberate thinking. <i>What do you think you re doing.</i>
thinking	Using thought or rational judgement; intelligent. <i>I am wrap d in dismal thinkings.</i>
understand	Be understanding of. <i>I understand you have no previous experience.</i>
