

Synonyms of "Concerning" as an adjective (14 Words)

<u>alarming</u>	Worrying or disturbing. <i>Our countryside is disappearing at an alarming rate.</i>
bothersome	Causing irritation or annoyance. Most childhood stomach aches though bothersome aren t serious.
<u>daunting</u>	Seeming difficult to deal with in prospect; intimidating. A daunting task.
harassing	Characterized by or using aggressive pressure or intimidation. <i>Harassing</i> behaviour is a common occurrence in many places.
harrowing	Acutely distressing. A harrowing film about racism and violence.
nerve-racking	Extremely irritating to the nerves.
niggling	Causing slight but persistent annoyance, discomfort, or anxiety. <i>Niggling aches and pains</i> .



perturbing	Causing distress or worry or anxiety. His whereabouts remain a perturbing mystery.
taxing	Physically or mentally demanding. They find the work too taxing .
<u>troublesome</u>	Causing difficulty or annoyance. Schools are removing troublesome pupils.
trying	Difficult or annoying; hard to endure. A trying day at the office.
<u>unsettling</u>	Causing anxiety or uneasiness; disturbing. The finale may come as an unsettling shock.
<u>vexatious</u>	Causing or tending to cause annoyance, frustration, or worry <i>A frivolous or vexatious</i> litigant.
worrisome	Causing anxiety or concern. In a particularly worrisome predicament.

Associations of "Concerning" (30 Words)

affect	Have an effect on; make a difference to. Your attitude will affect how successful you are.
<u>afraid</u>	Feeling worry or concern or insecurity. I m afraid of dogs.
<u>annoy</u>	Cause annoyance in disturb especially by minor irritations. A gallant Saxon who annoy ed this Coast.
anxious	Feeling or showing worry, nervousness, or unease about something with an uncertain outcome. <i>She was extremely anxious about her exams.</i>



appertain	Be appropriate or applicable. The answers generally appertain to improvements in standard of service.
bother	Feel concern about or interest in. It bother ed me that I hadn t done anything.
bothersome	Annoying; troublesome. Aircraft noise is particularly bothersome near the airport.
distressing	Causing distress or worry or anxiety. <i>Distressing</i> or disturbing news.
disturbing	Causing distress or worry or anxiety. A disturbing amount of crime.
environmental	Concerned with the ecological effects of altering the environment. <i>Environmental</i> tourism.
<u>haunting</u>	The action of haunting a place. The cathedral organ and the distant voices have a haunting beauty.
headache	Something or someone that causes anxiety; a source of unhappiness. She complained of a severe headache .
inconvenience	To cause inconvenience or discomfort to. Noise and fumes from traffic would inconvenience residents.
incubus	A male demon believed to have sexual intercourse with sleeping women. Debt is a big incubus in developing countries.
nuisance	A person or thing causing inconvenience or annoyance. I hope you re not going to make a nuisance of yourself.
<u>outrageous</u>	Very bold and unusual and rather shocking. Subjected to outrageous cruelty.
<u>pertain</u>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. Matters pertain ing to the organization of government.
<u>refer</u>	Make reference to. Christians refer to the mother of Jesus as the Virgin Mary.
<u>sensational</u>	Commanding attention. Cheap sensational periodicals.
shock	Affect with physiological shock or with an electric shock. Loss of blood is an important cause of shock .
<u>shocking</u>	Causing a feeling of surprise and dismay. <i>Shocking</i> behaviour.
situation	The location and surroundings of a place. The present international situation is dangerous.



solicitude	Care or concern for someone or something. I was touched by his solicitude .
<u>sorry</u>	In a poor or pitiful state. Sorry I was trying not to make a noise.
trouble	Take the trouble to do something concern oneself. That s the trouble with capitalism.
vex	Cause distress to. I ain t vex with you.
<u>vexation</u>	The state of being annoyed, frustrated, or worried. Jenna bit her lip in vexation .
worrisome	Causing distress or worry or anxiety. A worrisome problem.
<u>worry</u>	Feel or cause to feel anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems. <i>There was no need to worry her.</i>
worrying	Causing anxiety about actual or potential problems; alarming. A worrying time.
