- alarming** Worrying or disturbing.  
*Our countryside is disappearing at an **alarming** rate.*
- bothersome** Causing irritation or annoyance.  
*Most childhood stomach aches though **bothersome** aren't serious.*
- daunting** Seeming difficult to deal with in prospect; intimidating.  
*A **daunting** task.*
- harassing** Characterized by or using aggressive pressure or intimidation.  
***Harassing** behaviour is a common occurrence in many places.*
- harrowing** Acutely distressing.  
*A **harrowing** film about racism and violence.*
- nerve-racking** Extremely irritating to the nerves.
- nigging** Causing slight but persistent annoyance, discomfort, or anxiety.  
***Nigging** aches and pains.*

<b>perturbing</b>	Causing distress or worry or anxiety. <i>His whereabouts remain a <b>perturbing</b> mystery.</i>
<b>taxing</b>	Physically or mentally demanding. <i>They find the work too <b>taxing</b>.</i>
<b><u>troublesome</u></b>	Causing difficulty or annoyance. <i>Schools are removing <b>troublesome</b> pupils.</i>
<b>trying</b>	Difficult or annoying; hard to endure. <i>A <b>trying</b> day at the office.</i>
<b><u>unsettling</u></b>	Causing anxiety or uneasiness; disturbing. <i>The finale may come as an <b>unsettling</b> shock.</i>
<b><u>vexatious</u></b>	Causing or tending to cause annoyance, frustration, or worry. <i>A frivolous or <b>vexatious</b> litigant.</i>
<b>worrisome</b>	Causing anxiety or concern. <i>In a particularly <b>worrisome</b> predicament.</i>

- *A concerning breach of security.*



## Associations of "Concerning" (30 Words)

- affect** Have an effect on; make a difference to.  
*Your attitude will **affect** how successful you are.*
- afraid** Feeling worry or concern or insecurity.  
*I m **afraid** of dogs.*
- annoy** Cause annoyance in disturb especially by minor irritations.  
*A gallant Saxon who **annoyed** this Coast.*
- anxious** Feeling or showing worry, nervousness, or unease about something with an uncertain outcome.  
*She was extremely **anxious** about her exams.*

<b>appertain</b>	Be appropriate or applicable. <i>The answers generally <b>appertain</b> to improvements in standard of service.</i>
<b>bother</b>	Feel concern about or interest in. <i>It <b>bothered</b> me that I hadn't done anything.</i>
<b>bothersome</b>	Annoying; troublesome. <i>Aircraft noise is particularly <b>bothersome</b> near the airport.</i>
<b>distressing</b>	Causing distress or worry or anxiety. <i><b>Distressing</b> or disturbing news.</i>
<b>disturbing</b>	Causing distress or worry or anxiety. <i>A <b>disturbing</b> amount of crime.</i>
<b>environmental</b>	Concerned with the ecological effects of altering the environment. <i><b>Environmental</b> tourism.</i>
<b>haunting</b>	The action of haunting a place. <i>The cathedral organ and the distant voices have a <b>haunting</b> beauty.</i>
<b>headache</b>	Something or someone that causes anxiety; a source of unhappiness. <i>She complained of a severe <b>headache</b>.</i>
<b>inconvenience</b>	To cause inconvenience or discomfort to. <i>Noise and fumes from traffic would <b>inconvenience</b> residents.</i>
<b>incubus</b>	A male demon believed to have sexual intercourse with sleeping women. <i>Debt is a big <b>incubus</b> in developing countries.</i>
<b>nuisance</b>	A person or thing causing inconvenience or annoyance. <i>I hope you're not going to make a <b>nuisance</b> of yourself.</i>
<b>outrageous</b>	Very bold and unusual and rather shocking. <i>Subjected to <b>outrageous</b> cruelty.</i>
<b>pertain</b>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>Matters <b>pertaining</b> to the organization of government.</i>
<b>refer</b>	Make reference to. <i>Christians <b>refer</b> to the mother of Jesus as the Virgin Mary.</i>
<b>sensational</b>	Commanding attention. <i>Cheap <b>sensational</b> periodicals.</i>
<b>shock</b>	Affect with physiological shock or with an electric shock. <i>Loss of blood is an important cause of <b>shock</b>.</i>
<b>shocking</b>	Causing a feeling of surprise and dismay. <i><b>Shocking</b> behaviour.</i>
<b>situation</b>	The location and surroundings of a place. <i>The present international <b>situation</b> is dangerous.</i>

<b>solicitude</b>	Care or concern for someone or something. <i>I was touched by his <b>solicitude</b>.</i>
<b>sorry</b>	In a poor or pitiful state. <i><b>Sorry</b> I was trying not to make a noise.</i>
<b>trouble</b>	Take the trouble to do something concern oneself. <i>That s the <b>trouble</b> with capitalism.</i>
<b>vex</b>	Cause distress to. <i>I ain t <b>vex</b> with you.</i>
<b>vexation</b>	The state of being annoyed, frustrated, or worried. <i>Jenna bit her lip in <b>vexation</b>.</i>
<b>worrisome</b>	Causing distress or worry or anxiety. <i>A <b>worrisome</b> problem.</i>
<b>worry</b>	Feel or cause to feel anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems. <i>There was no need to <b>worry</b> her.</i>
<b>worrying</b>	Causing anxiety about actual or potential problems; alarming. <i>A <b>worrying</b> time.</i>
