- *A hotel employee whose job is to assist guests by booking tours, making theatre and restaurant reservations, etc.*

- auxiliary** An auxiliary person or thing.

- helper** A person who helps people or institutions (especially with financial help).

- menial** A person with a menial job.
- porter** A person employed to carry luggage and supplies.
*A hospital **porter**.*
- servant** A devoted and helpful follower or supporter.
*The state cannot be a **servant** of the church.*
- steward** The ship's officer who is in charge of provisions and dining arrangements.
*Farmers pride themselves on being **stewards** of the countryside.*
- waiter** A person who waits for a time, event, or opportunity.
- waitress** A woman whose job is to serve customers at their tables in a restaurant.
