assembly	A group of people elected to make laws or decisions for a particular country or region. <i>An assembly of dockers and labourers.</i>
conference	A linking of several phones or computers, so that each user may communicate with the others simultaneously. <i>An international conference on the environment.</i>
convention	Orthodoxy as a consequence of being conventional. <i>The convention of not naming the main character.</i>
convocation	A legislative or deliberative assembly of a university. <i>The arguments delayed the convocation of the first congress planned for February 1992.</i>

council	Denoting housing provided by a local council at a subsidized rent. <i>A ban on school buses using the road was imposed by the county council.</i>
gathering	The act of gathering something. <i>A family gathering.</i>
meeting	An assembly of people for a particular purpose, especially for formal discussion. <i>An athletics meeting.</i>
private meeting	An enlisted man of the lowest rank in the Army or Marines.
session	A period of recording music in a studio especially by a session musician. <i>Legislation to curb wildcat strikes will be introduced during the coming parliamentary session.</i>
summit	The highest point of a hill or mountain. <i>The region is a few molecules wide at the summit.</i>

anonymity	The condition of being anonymous. <i>The official spoke on condition of anonymity.</i>
assemblage	The social act of assembling. <i>The assemblage of electronic image and text databases.</i>
assembly	The conversion of instructions in low-level code to machine code. <i>The tail assembly of the aircraft.</i>
associational	Of or relating to associations or associationism.
clandestine	Kept secret or done secretly, especially because illicit. <i>She deserved better than these clandestine meetings.</i>
classified	A short ad in a newspaper or magazine (usually in small print) and appearing along with other ads of the same type. <i>Thousands of classified documents have now been declassified.</i>
concealed	Hidden on any grounds for any motive. <i>A concealed compartment in his briefcase.</i>
conference	Take part in a conference or conference call. <i>An international conference on the environment.</i>
confidential	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>In confidential tone of voice.</i>
confidentiality	The state of being secret. <i>You must respect the confidentiality of your client's communications.</i>

convocation	The act of convoking. <i>The arguments delayed the convocation of the first congress planned for February 1992.</i>
covert	A thicket in which game can hide. <i>The brush provided a covert for game.</i>
cumulate	An igneous rock formed by gravitational settling of particles in a magma. <i>Cumulate gabbro.</i>
esoteric	Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. <i>Esoteric philosophical debates.</i>
esoterica	Esoteric or highly specialized subjects or publications. <i>A professor of such esoterica as angelology and comparative shamanism.</i>
furtive	Marked by quiet and caution and secrecy; taking pains to avoid being observed. <i>The look in his eyes became furtive.</i>
gathering	The act of gathering something. <i>A family gathering.</i>
inward	Directed or moving inward or toward a center. <i>Move the needle further inwards.</i>
leakage	The accidental admission or escape of liquid or gas through a hole or crack. <i>Suspicion as to the source of the leakage had fallen on a variety of people.</i>
meeting	A small informal social gathering. <i>There was no meeting of minds.</i>
personal	Existing as a self aware entity not as an abstraction or an impersonal force. <i>He had the cheek to make personal remarks.</i>
private	Concerning things deeply private and personal. <i>Our prisoner was just a private and knew nothing of value.</i>
rendezvous	Meet at a rendezvous. <i>You d be welcome to use this place as a rendezvous.</i>
secret	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>A state secret.</i>
stealthy	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i>Stealthy footsteps.</i>
surreptitious	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>Low wages were supplemented by surreptitious payments from tradesmen.</i>

- tryst** A secret rendezvous (especially between lovers).
*A moonlight **tryst**.*
- undercover** Involving secret work within a community or organization, especially for the purposes of police investigation or espionage.
*He worked **undercover** in Northern Ireland.*
- underhand** Slyly and secretly.
*Oldline aristocratic diplomats **underhandedly** undermined the attempt to align Germany with the Western democracies.*
- underhanded** With hand brought forward and up from below shoulder level.
***Underhanded** practices.*
