<a href="#">assembly</a>	A group of people elected to make laws or decisions for a particular country or region. <i>An <b>assembly</b> of dockers and labourers.</i>
<a href="#">conference</a>	A linking of several phones or computers, so that each user may communicate with the others simultaneously. <i>An international <b>conference</b> on the environment.</i>
<a href="#">convention</a>	Orthodoxy as a consequence of being conventional. <i>The <b>convention</b> of not naming the main character.</i>
<a href="#">convocation</a>	A legislative or deliberative assembly of a university. <i>The arguments delayed the <b>convocation</b> of the first congress planned for February 1992.</i>

<b>council</b>	Denoting housing provided by a local council at a subsidized rent. <i>A ban on school buses using the road was imposed by the county <b>council</b>.</i>
<b>gathering</b>	The act of gathering something. <i>A family <b>gathering</b>.</i>
<b>meeting</b>	An assembly of people for a particular purpose, especially for formal discussion. <i>An athletics <b>meeting</b>.</i>
<b>private meeting</b>	An enlisted man of the lowest rank in the Army or Marines.
<b>session</b>	A period of recording music in a studio especially by a session musician. <i>Legislation to curb wildcat strikes will be introduced during the coming parliamentary <b>session</b>.</i>
<b>summit</b>	The highest point of a hill or mountain. <i>The region is a few molecules wide at the <b>summit</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Conclave" (30 Words)

<b>anonymity</b>	The condition of being anonymous. <i>The official spoke on condition of <b>anonymity</b>.</i>
<b>assemblage</b>	The social act of assembling. <i>The <b>assemblage</b> of electronic image and text databases.</i>
<b>assembly</b>	The conversion of instructions in low-level code to machine code. <i>The tail <b>assembly</b> of the aircraft.</i>
<b>associational</b>	Of or relating to associations or associationism.
<b>clandestine</b>	Kept secret or done secretly, especially because illicit. <i>She deserved better than these <b>clandestine</b> meetings.</i>
<b>classified</b>	A short ad in a newspaper or magazine (usually in small print) and appearing along with other ads of the same type. <i>Thousands of <b>classified</b> documents have now been <b>declassified</b>.</i>
<b>concealed</b>	Hidden on any grounds for any motive. <i>A <b>concealed</b> compartment in his briefcase.</i>
<b>conference</b>	Take part in a conference or conference call. <i>An international <b>conference</b> on the environment.</i>
<b>confidential</b>	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>In <b>confidential</b> tone of voice.</i>
<b>confidentiality</b>	The state of being secret. <i>You must respect the <b>confidentiality</b> of your client's communications.</i>

<b>convocation</b>	The act of convoking. <i>The arguments delayed the <b>convocation</b> of the first congress planned for February 1992.</i>
<b>covert</b>	A thicket in which game can hide. <i>The brush provided a <b>covert</b> for game.</i>
<b>cumulate</b>	An igneous rock formed by gravitational settling of particles in a magma. <i><b>Cumulate</b> gabbro.</i>
<b>esoteric</b>	Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. <i><b>Esoteric</b> philosophical debates.</i>
<b>esoterica</b>	Esoteric or highly specialized subjects or publications. <i>A professor of such <b>esoterica</b> as angelology and comparative shamanism.</i>
<b>furtive</b>	Marked by quiet and caution and secrecy; taking pains to avoid being observed. <i>The look in his eyes became <b>furtive</b>.</i>
<b>gathering</b>	The act of gathering something. <i>A family <b>gathering</b>.</i>
<b>inward</b>	Directed or moving inward or toward a center. <i>Move the needle further <b>inwards</b>.</i>
<b>leakage</b>	The accidental admission or escape of liquid or gas through a hole or crack. <i>Suspicion as to the source of the <b>leakage</b> had fallen on a variety of people.</i>
<b>meeting</b>	A small informal social gathering. <i>There was no <b>meeting</b> of minds.</i>
<b>personal</b>	Existing as a self aware entity not as an abstraction or an impersonal force. <i>He had the cheek to make <b>personal</b> remarks.</i>
<b>private</b>	Concerning things deeply private and personal. <i>Our prisoner was just a <b>private</b> and knew nothing of value.</i>
<b>rendezvous</b>	Meet at a rendezvous. <i>You d be welcome to use this place as a <b>rendezvous</b>.</i>
<b>secret</b>	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>A state <b>secret</b>.</i>
<b>stealthy</b>	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i><b>Stealthy</b> footsteps.</i>
<b>surreptitious</b>	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>Low wages were supplemented by <b>surreptitious</b> payments from tradesmen.</i>

- tryst** A secret rendezvous (especially between lovers).  
*A moonlight **tryst**.*
- undercover** Involving secret work within a community or organization, especially for the purposes of police investigation or espionage.  
*He worked **undercover** in Northern Ireland.*
- underhand** Slyly and secretly.  
*Oldline aristocratic diplomats **underhandedly** undermined the attempt to align Germany with the Western democracies.*
- underhanded** With hand brought forward and up from below shoulder level.  
***Underhanded** practices.*
