### Definitions of "Concoct" as a verb

- *Prepare or cook by mixing ingredients.*
- *Make (a dish or meal) by combining various ingredients.*
- *Create or devise (a story or plan).*
- *Invent.*
- *Devise or invent.*



## Synonyms of "Concoct" as a verb (15 Words)

<a href="#"><u>assemble</u></a>	Cause (people or things) to gather together for a common purpose. <i><b>Assemble</b> your colleagues.</i>
<b>contrive</b>	Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort. <i>His opponents <b>contrived</b> a cabinet crisis.</i>
<b>cook up</b>	Prepare for eating by applying heat.
<b>dream up</b>	Experience while sleeping.
<b>fabricate</b>	Construct or manufacture (an industrial product), especially from prepared components. <i>You will have to <b>fabricate</b> an exhaust system.</i>
<b>hatch</b>	Emerge from the eggs. <i>Young birds fish and reptiles <b>hatch</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>invent</u></a>	Make up something artificial or untrue. <i>He <b>invented</b> an improved form of the steam engine.</i>

<b>make</b>	Make by combining materials and parts. <i>What do you <b>make</b> of his remarks.</i>
<b>make up</b>	Behave in a certain way.
<b>manufacture</b>	Invent (evidence or a story). <i>He <b>manufactured</b> a popular cereal.</i>
<b><u>prepare</u></b>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i><b>Prepare</b> the discord in bar 139.</i>
<b>put together</b>	Make an investment.
<b>think of</b>	Have in mind as a purpose.
<b>think up</b>	Ponder; reflect on, or reason about.
<b>trump up</b>	Raise.



## Usage Examples of "Concoct" as a verb

- *She began to concoct a dinner likely to appeal to him.*
- *Concoct a strange mixture.*



- *His cronies concocted a simple plan.*



## Associations of "Concoct" (30 Words)

<b><u>artifice</u></b>	Clever or cunning devices or expedients, especially as used to trick or deceive others. <i>The style is not free from the <b>artifices</b> of the period.</i>
<b><u>assumed</u></b>	Adopted as a basis of reasoning; expected. <i>The <b>assumed</b> result of the election.</i>
<b>build</b>	Be engaged in building. <i>The government is <b>building</b> new schools in this state.</i>
<b>construct</b>	A physical thing which is deliberately built or formed. <i><b>Reconstruct</b> the events of 20 years ago.</i>
<b>counterfeit</b>	Not genuine; imitating something superior. <i>No pretence could have <b>counterfeited</b> such terror.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create by artistic means. <i>Callas <b>created</b> only one role and that was Eurydice.</i>
<b><u>deliberate</u></b>	Think about carefully; weigh. <i>With all <b>deliberate</b> speed.</i>
<b>deliberately</b>	Consciously and intentionally; on purpose. <i>The fire was started <b>deliberately</b>.</i>

<b>designed</b>	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent. <i>The aircraft performed their <b>designed</b> functions well.</i>
<b>fabricate</b>	Invent (something) in order to deceive. <i>Officers <b>fabricated</b> evidence.</i>
<b>fabrication</b>	The action or process of manufacturing or inventing something. <i>The synthesis and <b>fabrication</b> of single crystals.</i>
<b>falsehood</b>	The state of being untrue. <i>A downright <b>falsehood</b>.</i>
<b>fancied</b>	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A <b>fancied</b> wrong.</i>
<b>fictitious</b>	Occurring in or invented for fiction. <i>Reports of a deal were dismissed as <b>fictitious</b> by the Minister.</i>
<b>figment</b>	A contrived or fantastic idea. <i>A <b>figment</b> of the imagination.</i>
<b>forge</b>	Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort. <i>She <b>forged</b> a Green Card.</i>
<b>forgery</b>	A copy that is represented as the original. <i>He was found guilty of <b>forgery</b>.</i>
<b>imitative</b>	(of a word) reproducing a natural sound (e.g. fizz) or pronounced in a way that is thought to correspond to the appearance or character of the object or action described (e.g. blob). <i>Acting is an <b>imitative</b> art.</i>
<b>intentionality</b>	The fact of being deliberate or purposive.
<b>make</b>	Make by shaping or bringing together constituents. <i>Wood <b>makes</b> good furniture.</i>
<b>misinform</b>	Give (someone) false or inaccurate information. <i>I m afraid you have been <b>misinformed</b>.</i>
<b>mislead</b>	Give false or misleading information to. <i>The government misled the public about the road's environmental impact.</i>
<b>persona</b>	A personal facade that one presents to the world. <i>Bowie burned through one <b>persona</b> after another.</i>
<b>pretended</b>	Not genuine; assumed. <i>Eating ice cream with <b>pretended</b> unconcern.</i>
<b>purposefully</b>	Intentionally and deliberately. <i>Rachael takes the lead striding <b>purposefully</b> towards the door.</i>

<b>purposely</b>	On purpose; intentionally. <i>She had <b>purposely</b> made it difficult.</i>
<u><b>ruse</b></u>	An action intended to deceive someone; a trick. <i>Emma tried to think of a <b>ruse</b> to get Paul out of the house.</i>
<b>scheme</b>	Devise a system or form a scheme for. <i>The occupational sick pay <b>scheme</b>.</i>
<u><b>sham</b></u>	Something that is a counterfeit; not what it seems to be. <i>George abhorred <b>sham</b> and affectation.</i>
<b>skillfully</b>	With skill. <i>Fragments of a nearly complete jug <b>skillfully</b> restored at the institute of archaeology.</i>
