Definitions of "Concoction" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “concoction” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A mixture of various ingredients or elements.*
- *An elaborate story, especially a fabricated one.*
- *The act of creating something (a medicine or drink or soup etc.) by compounding or mixing a variety of components.*
- *An elaborate or showy garment or hat.*
- *The invention of a scheme or story to suit some purpose.*
- *Any foodstuff made by combining different ingredients.*
- *An occurrence of an unusual mixture.*



Synonyms of "Concoction" as a noun (16 Words)

- blend** The act of blending components together thoroughly.
*Nearly all Scotch whiskies are **blends**.*
- brew** Drink made by steeping and boiling and fermenting rather than distilling.
*She took a sip of the hot reviving **brew**.*
- combination** A sequence of numbers or letters used to open a combination lock.
*Woollen **combinations**.*
- composite** A composite constructional material.
*The English legal system is a **composite** of legislation and judicial precedent.*
- compound** An enclosure of residences and other building (especially in the Orient).
*A **compound** of hydrogen and oxygen.*
- confection** An elaborately constructed thing, especially a frivolous one.
*A fruit **confection**.*

contrivance	The use of skill to create or bring about something, especially with a consequent effect of artificiality. <i>His testimony was just a contrivance to throw us off the track.</i>
creation	An artifact that has been brought into existence by someone. <i>She treats fictional creations as if they were real people.</i>
fabrication	The action or process of manufacturing or inventing something. <i>The story was a complete fabrication.</i>
falsification	The act of determining that something is false. <i>An investigation into fraud and the falsification of records.</i>
intermixture	The act of mixing together. <i>Delicate shadings result from the intermixture of dyes.</i>
<u>invention</u>	Something, typically a process or device, that has been invented. <i>You know my story is an invention.</i>
mix	The proportion of different people or other constituents that make up a mixture. <i>Arriving at the correct mix of full time to part time staff.</i>
<u>mixture</u>	An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>The old town is a mixture of narrow medieval streets and 18th century architecture.</i>
piece of fiction	A musical work that has been created.
preparation	A substance prepared according to a formula. <i>The project is in preparation.</i>

- *She wore a skin-tight concoction of bugle heads and sequins.*
- *It suddenly spewed out a thick green concoction.*
- *His testimony was a concoction.*

- *The facade is a strange concoction of northern Mannerism and Italian Baroque.*
