<b>accompanying</b>	Following or accompanying as a consequence. <i>The <b>accompanying</b> documentation.</i>
<b>after</b>	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>The <b>after</b> cabin.</i>
<b>afterthought</b>	Thinking again about a choice previously made. <i>The garage was an <b>afterthought</b>.</i>

<b>coeval</b>	Having the same age or date of origin; contemporary. <i>These lavas were <b>coeval</b> with the volcanic activity.</i>
<a href="#">contemporaneous</a>	Of the same period. <i>A rise in interest rates is often <b>contemporaneous</b> with an increase in inflation.</i>
<a href="#">contemporary</a>	Living or occurring at the same time. <i>The tension and complexities of our <b>contemporary</b> society.</i>
<a href="#">ensuing</a>	Occurring afterwards or as a result. <i>She lost track of one of her children during the <b>ensuing</b> chaos.</i>
<b>hereafter</b>	In a future life or state. <i>He'd promised that Rachel would be the idol of his heart <b>hereafter</b>.</i>
<b>later</b>	Comparative of the adverb `late. <i><b>Later</b> medical science could have saved the child.</i>
<a href="#">next</a>	The next person or thing. <i>The <b>next</b> chapter.</i>

<b>passing</b>	In sport the action of passing a ball to another team member. <i>A <b>passing</b> grade.</i>
<b>period</b>	A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table. <i>An attractive and beautifully modernized <b>period</b> house.</i>
<b>postmodern</b>	Of or relating to postmodernism. <i><b>Postmodern</b> deconstructionist theories.</i>
<b>recent</b>	The Holocene epoch. <i><b>Recent</b> graduates.</i>
<b>recently</b>	At a recent time; not long ago. <i>He was in Paris <b>recently</b>.</i>
<b>sequent</b>	In regular succession without gaps. <i>Some of the inferences are not <b>sequent</b> on the premises.</i>
<b><u>shortly</u></b>	At a short distance. <i>He said <b>shortly</b> that he didn't like it.</i>
<b><u>simultaneous</u></b>	Occurring, operating, or done at the same time. <i><b>Simultaneous</b> translation.</i>
<b><u>soon</u></b>	In the near future. <i>I'd just as <b>soon</b> Tim did it.</i>
<b><u>subsequent</u></b>	Following in time or order. <i>The theory was developed <b>subsequent</b> to the earthquake of 1906.</i>
<b>subsequently</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>He apologized <b>subsequently</b>.</i>
<b>successor</b>	A thing or person that immediately replaces something or someone. <i>He was President Lincoln's <b>successor</b>.</i>
<b><u>synchronize</u></b>	Operate simultaneously. <i>You can <b>synchronize</b> your calendar with your GPS device and be alerted when you need to leave for an appointment.</i>
<b>synchronous</b>	Occurring or existing at the same time or having the same period or phase. <i>Recovery was <b>synchronous</b> with therapy.</i>
<b>time</b>	Assign a time for an activity or event. <i>He called four <b>times</b>.</i>
<b>timing</b>	The time when something happens. <i>The introduction of new signal <b>timings</b>.</i>
<b><u>year</u></b>	A period similar to a year used for reckoning time according to other calendars. <i>A school <b>year</b>.</i>
