Definitions of "Concrete" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “concrete” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Existing in a material or physical form; not abstract.*
- *Capable of being perceived by the senses; not abstract or imaginary.*
- *Formed by the coalescence of particles.*
- *Specific; definite.*
- *(of a noun) denoting a material object as opposed to an abstract quality, state, or action.*



Synonyms of "Concrete" as an adjective (16 Words)

conclusive	(of evidence or argument) having or likely to have the effect of proving a case; decisive. <i>The evidence is conclusive.</i>
definite	Clearly stated or decided; not vague or doubtful. <i>A definite statement of the terms of the will.</i>
definitive	Of recognized authority or excellence. <i>The definitive work on Greece.</i>
existing	Existing in something specified. <i>The existing system.</i>
firm	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i>The snow was firm underfoot.</i>
material	Having material or physical form or substance Benjamin Jowett. <i>The insects did not do any material damage to the crop.</i>
palpable	(medicine) can be felt by palpation. <i>A barely palpable dust.</i>
physical	Impelled by physical force especially against resistance. <i>The physical size of a computer.</i>
positive	Having a positive charge. <i>He made a positive identification of a glossy ibis.</i>

real	Coinciding with reality. <i>An increase in real terms of 11 6 per cent.</i>
<u>solid</u>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>The bank is solid and will survive this attack.</i>
<u>specific</u>	Stated explicitly or in detail. <i>Quinine is highly specific for malaria.</i>
<u>tactile</u>	(of a person) given to touching other people, especially as an unselfconscious expression of sympathy or affection. <i>Tactile exhibitions help blind people enjoy the magic of sculpture.</i>
<u>tangible</u>	Clear and definite; real. <i>Tangible assets such as machinery.</i>
touchable	Perceptible by the senses especially the sense of touch.
<u>visible</u>	Present and easily available. <i>Visible resources.</i>



Usage Examples of "Concrete" as an adjective

- *I haven't got any concrete proof.*
- *Concrete objects like stones.*
- *Concrete objects such as trees.*



Associations of "Concrete" (30 Words)

adobe	A building constructed from adobe clay or bricks. <i>Adobe houses.</i>
alabaster	Like alabaster in whiteness and smoothness. <i>Alabaster statue.</i>
asphalt	The pitch used in asphalt sometimes found in natural deposits but usually made by the distillation of crude oil. <i>Asphalt the driveway.</i>
brick	Block or enclose with a wall of bricks. <i>I had one of those Motorola bricks as my first cell phone.</i>
build	Build or establish something abstract. <i>The county council plans to build a bypass.</i>
calcite	A common mineral consisting of crystallized calcium carbonate; a major constituent of limestone.

calcium	A white metallic element that burns with a brilliant light; the fifth most abundant element in the earth's crust; an important component of most plants and animals.
<u>cement</u>	Concrete pavement is sometimes referred to as cement. <i>We cemented our friendship.</i>
<u>clay</u>	A hardened clay surface for a tennis court. <i>Honor comes to bless the turf that wraps their clay.</i>
gypsum	A common white or colorless mineral (hydrated calcium sulphate) used to make cements and plasters (especially plaster of Paris).
hardened	Used of persons emotionally hardened. <i>Hardened police officers.</i>
inured	Made tough by habitual exposure- Robert Lynd- V.S.Pritchett. <i>A peasant dark lean faced wind inured.</i>
kiln	A furnace for firing or burning or drying such things as porcelain or bricks.
lime	The green acidic fruit of any of various lime trees. <i>The oak had to be limed then waxed and then brushed to get that particular effect.</i>
marble	Stain or streak something so that it looks like marble. <i>A pair of dramatic marbles showing dogs attacking a buck.</i>
masonry	Freemasonry. <i>Hands roughened from carpentry and masonry.</i>
pave	Cover (a piece of ground) with flat stones or bricks; lay paving over. <i>Pave the roads in the village.</i>
pavement	A raised paved or asphalted path for pedestrians at the side of a road. <i>A pavement cafe.</i>
plaster	Apply a plaster cast or medical plaster to a part of the body. <i>Are they expecting the air force to plaster the city tonight or what.</i>
porphyry	Any igneous rock with crystals embedded in a finer groundmass of minerals.
resolved	Determined. <i>Mysteries solved and unsolved problems resolved and unresolved.</i>
sculpt	Create or represent (something) by carving, casting, or other shaping techniques. <i>She was teaching him how to sculpt.</i>
<u>sculpture</u>	Form or shape as if by sculpture especially with strong smooth curves. <i>The choir stalls were each carefully sculptured.</i>
slab	Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks. <i>He handled the rope competently and set out up the centre of the slab.</i>

slate	Cover with slate. <i>A grey slate roof.</i>
<u>solid</u>	A substance or object that is solid rather than liquid or fluid. <i>The solid outline encloses the area within which we measured.</i>
<u>steel</u>	A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened. <i>Nerves of steel.</i>
<u>stone</u>	Build face or pave with stone. <i>I weighed 10 stone.</i>
tarmac	A runway or other area surfaced with tarmac or a similar material. <i>They ll be wanting to tarmac the path.</i>
tile	Cover with tiles. <i>Tile the wall and the floor of the bathroom.</i>
