Definitions of "Concubine" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “concubine” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *(in polygamous societies) a woman who lives with a man but has lower status than his wife or wives.*
- *A woman who cohabits with an important man.*
- *A mistress.*

Synonyms of "Concubine" as a noun (5 Words)

courtesan	A woman who cohabits with an important man. <i>They diverted their remaining funds into frequenting courtesans.</i>
doxy	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
kept woman	The financial means whereby one lives.
mistress	An adulterous woman; a woman who has an ongoing extramarital sexual relationship with a man. <i>A mistress of the sound bite she is famed for the acidity of her tongue.</i>
paramour	A woman’s lover.

Associations of "Concubine" (30 Words)

beau	A man who is the lover of a man or woman.
boyfriend	Denoting an item of clothing for a woman or girl that is designed to be loose-fitting or slightly oversized. <i>When the law changed Pet could finally married his long time boyfriend Jim.</i>
buff	Of the yellowish beige color of buff leather. <i>Swimming in the buff means to swim naked.</i>
cohabit	Live together and have a sexual relationship without being married. <i>Mary is now cohabiting with Paul.</i>
devotee	A person who is very interested in and enthusiastic about someone or something. <i>A devotee of Lewis Carroll.</i>
estranged	Caused to be unloved. <i>Her estranged father.</i>
ex	A woman who was formerly a particular man's wife. <i>All his exes live in Texas.</i>
fan	A fan shaped alluvial or talus deposit at the foot of a slope. <i>The speaker ceased to be an amusing little gnat to be fanned away and was kicked off the forum.</i>
fiance	A man who is engaged to be married.
fiancee	A woman who is engaged to be married.
girlfriend	Any female friend. <i>She would rather go to the cinema with a girlfriend.</i>
guy	Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>The Italians guyed the Tower of Pisa to prevent it from collapsing.</i>
husband	Use cautiously and frugally. <i>She husbanded their financial resources through difficult times.</i>
idolater	A person who worships idols.
idolatry	The worship of idols; the worship of images that are not God. <i>We must not allow our idolatry of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>
imperial	Relating to an empire. <i>The imperial family.</i>
lover	A significant other to whom you are not related by marriage. <i>I think she had a secret lover.</i>

married	Married people. <i>We were young marrieds during World War Two.</i>
marry	(of a parent or guardian) give (a son or daughter) in marriage. <i>Most Chardonnays don t marry well with salmon.</i>
mistress	A woman who is skilled in a particular subject or activity. <i>A mistress of the sound bite she is famed for the acidity of her tongue.</i>
moll	A prostitute. <i>I d rush the money over to his moll.</i>
morganatic	Of a marriage between one of royal or noble birth and one of lower rank; valid but with the understanding that the rank of the inferior remains unchanged and offspring do not succeed to titles or property of the superior. <i>He contracted a morganatic marriage with a German born actress.</i>
newlywed	Someone recently married.
<u>paramour</u>	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
<u>partner</u>	A person s partner in marriage. <i>She lived with her partner.</i>
polygamy	Having more than one spouse at a time.
<u>spouse</u>	A husband or wife, considered in relation to their partner.
votary	One bound by vows to a religion or life of worship or service. <i>He was a votary of John Keats.</i>
wed	The fourth day of the week; the third working day. <i>Will you wed your daughter to him.</i>
<u>wife</u>	The wife of a person with a specified occupation. <i>He and his wife are keen gardeners.</i>
