| <b>guy</b>        | Steady or support with a guy wire or cable.<br><i>The Italians <b>guyed</b> the Tower of Pisa to prevent it from collapsing.</i>  |
| <b>husband</b>    | Use cautiously and frugally.<br><i>She <b>husbanded</b> their financial resources through difficult times.</i>  |
| <b>idolater</b>   | A person who worships idols.  |
| <b>idolatry</b>   | The worship of idols; the worship of images that are not God.<br><i>We must not allow our <b>idolatry</b> of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>   |
| <b>imperial</b>   | Relating to an empire.<br><i>The <b>imperial</b> family.</i>  |
| <b>lover</b>      | A significant other to whom you are not related by marriage.<br><i>I think she had a secret <b>lover</b>.</i>   |

| <b>newlywed</b>        | Someone recently married.  |
| <b><u>paramour</u></b> | A woman who cohabits with an important man.  |
| <b><u>partner</u></b>  | A person s partner in marriage.<br><i>She lived with her <b>partner</b>.</i>   |
| <b>polygamy</b>        | Having more than one spouse at a time.   |
| <b><u>spouse</u></b>   | A husband or wife, considered in relation to their partner.  |
| <b>votary</b>          | One bound by vows to a religion or life of worship or service.<br><i>He was a <b>votary</b> of John Keats.</i>   |
