Definitions of "Condense" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “condense” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Remove water from.*
- *Become more compact or concentrated.*
- *Undergo condensation; change from a gaseous to a liquid state and fall in drops.*
- *Change or cause to change from a gas or vapour to a liquid.*
- *Develop due to condensation.*
- *Make more concise.*
- *Express (written or spoken material) in fewer words; make concise.*
- *Compress or concentrate.*
- *Cause a gas or vapor to change into a liquid.*
- *Make (something) denser or more concentrated.*



Synonyms of "Condense" as a verb (20 Words)

abbreviate	Reduce in scope while retaining essential elements. <i>I decided to abbreviate my stay in Cambridge.</i>
<u>abridge</u>	Curtail (a right or privilege). <i>Even the right to free speech can be abridged.</i>
abridged	Lessen, diminish, or curtail.
become liquid	Enter or assume a certain state or condition.
<u>compact</u>	Make more compact by or as if by pressing. <i>The foundation of the walls compacted of Granite and Lime.</i>
<u>compress</u>	Be squeezed or pressed together or into a smaller space. <i>The skirt can be folded and compressed into a relatively small bag.</i>
concentrate	Compress or concentrate. <i>A threatened tax rise concentrates the mind wonderfully.</i>
contract	Enter into a contractual arrangement. <i>Politically committed members contract into paying the levy.</i>
cut	Cut down on make a reduction in. <i>The coach cut two players from the team.</i>

deliquesce	Melt away in the process of decay. <i>This type of salt deliquesces easily.</i>
<u>digest</u>	Soften or disintegrate by means of chemical action, heat, or moisture. <i>I cannot digest milk products.</i>
distil	Undergo the process of distillation. <i>The acid distills at a specific temperature.</i>
<u>distill</u>	Remove impurities from increase the concentration of and separate through the process of distillation. <i>The doctor distilled a few drops of disinfectant onto the wound.</i>
liquefy	Make or become liquid. <i>The minimum pressure required to liquefy a gas.</i>
liquidize	Convert solid food into a liquid or puree typically by using a liquidizer. <i>Liquidize the soup until quite smooth.</i>
<u>precipitate</u>	Separate as a fine suspension of solid particles. <i>The incident precipitated a political crisis.</i>
<u>shorten</u>	Make (a vowel or syllable) short. <i>Patients whose waiting time had been shortened.</i>
shortened	Edit by omitting or modifying parts considered indelicate.
telescope	Make smaller or shorter. <i>Five steel sections that telescope into one another.</i>
<u>truncated</u>	Make shorter as if by cutting off.



Usage Examples of "Condense" as a verb

- *Her feelings condensed.*
- *Condense the contents of a book into a summary.*
- *He condensed the three plays into a three-hour drama.*
- *The morning play on Saturday was condensed into a half-hour package.*
- *The moisture vapour in the air condenses into droplets of water.*
- *Water condenses.*
- *Congress condensed the three-year plan into a six-month plan.*
- *All our planets condensed out of the same material.*
- *The cold air condensed the steam.*
- *The cold air was condensing his breath.*
- *Condense the milk.*



Associations of "Condense" (30 Words)

chill	Chilly. <i>They had some champagne chilling in the fridge.</i>
cold	A low temperature cold weather a cold environment. <i>A cold bluish grey.</i>
<u>compact</u>	Make more compact by or as if by pressing. <i>A compact summary of the play.</i>
compactly	With concise and precise brevity; to the point. <i>He wrote compactly but clearly.</i>
<u>compress</u>	Express in a shorter form; abridge. <i>In this chapter we compress into summary form the main findings.</i>
compressed	Pressed tightly together. <i>With lips compressed.</i>
compression	The reduction in volume (causing an increase in pressure) of the fuel mixture in an internal combustion engine before ignition.

concentrate	A substance made by removing or reducing the diluting agent a concentrated form of something. Concentrate juice.
<u>constrict</u>	Make narrower, especially by encircling pressure. Boas constrict and suffocate their prey.
crush	Crush or bruise. A number of youngsters fainted in the crush .
cryogenic	Relating to or involving the branch of physics that deals with the production and effects of very low temperatures. A body being prepared for cryogenic preservation.
<u>crystallize</u>	Assume crystalline form become crystallized. When most liquids freeze they crystallize .
economizer	A person who reduces expenditure.
flatten	Lower (a note) in pitch by a semitone. The entire town centre was flattened by the 500 lb bomb.
focus	Become focussed or come into focus. Please focus on your studies and not on your hobbies.
freeze	Cause to freeze. A freeze on hiring.
ice	A frozen mixture of fruit juice or of flavoured water and sugar. Americans like ice in their drinks.
lemon	A drink made from or flavoured with lemon juice. A lemon T shirt.
mash	A mixture of mashed malt grains and hot water used in brewing. The barley is dried out over peat fires and mashed with water which flows through peat ground.
<u>minimize</u>	Make small or insignificant. Let s minimize the risk.
<u>packed</u>	Pressed together or compressed. Packed snow.
pinch	Make ridges into by pinching together. If I scraped and pinched a bit I might manage.
<u>pressed</u>	Flattened, shaped, or smoothed by the application of pressure, typically from an iron. Freshly pressed orange juice.
quash	Put down by force or intimidation. The government quashes any attempt of an uprising.

- refrigerant** Any substance used to provide cooling (as in a refrigerator).
*One of the **refrigerant** pipes had burst.*
- refrigeration** The process of subjecting food or drink to cold in order to chill or preserve it.
***Refrigeration** by immersing the patient's body in a cold bath.*
- solidify** Make solid or more solid cause to solidify.
*Social and political pressures helped to **solidify** national identities.*
- squash** Edible fruit of a squash plant eaten as a vegetable.
*Orange **squash**.*
- squeeze** Squeeze tightly between the fingers.
*I cocked the gun and **squeezed** the trigger.*
- wring** An act of squeezing or twisting something.
***Wring** the towels.*
