According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "condense" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Remove water from.
- Become more compact or concentrated.
- *Undergo condensation; change from a gaseous to a liquid state and fall in drops.*
- Change or cause to change from a gas or vapour to a liquid.
- Develop due to condensation.
- Make more concise.
- Express (written or spoken material) in fewer words; make concise.
- Compress or concentrate.
- Cause a gas or vapor to change into a liquid.
- Make (something) denser or more concentrated.





### Synonyms of "Condense" as a verb (20 Words)

**abbreviate** Reduce in scope while retaining essential elements.

I decided to **abbreviate** my stay in Cambridge.

abridge Curtail (a right or privilege.

Even the right to free speech can be **abridge**d.

**abridged** Lessen, diminish, or curtail.

**become liquid** Enter or assume a certain state or condition.

Make more compact by or as if by pressing.

The foundation of the walls **compact**ed of Granite and Lime.

Be squeezed or pressed together or into a smaller space.

**compress**The skirt can be folded and **compress**ed into a relatively small bag.

**concentrate** Compress or concentrate.

A threatened tax rise **concentrate**s the mind wonderfully.

contract. Enter into a contractual arrangement.

Politically committed members **contract** into paying the levy.

cut Cut down on make a reduction in.

The coach **cut** two players from the team.



**deliquesce** Melt away in the process of decay.

This type of salt **deliquesce**s easily.

Soften or disintegrate by means of chemical action, heat, or moisture.

I cannot **digest** milk products.

distil

Undergo the process of distillation.

The acid **distil**ls at a specific temperature.

Remove impurities from increase the concentration of and separate

**distill** through the process of distillation.

The doctor **distill**ed a few drops of disinfectant onto the wound.

liquefy Make or become liquid.

The minimum pressure required to **liquefy** a gas.

liquidize Convert solid food into a liquid or puree typically by using a liquidizer.

**Liquidize** the soup until quite smooth.

**precipitate**Separate as a fine suspension of solid particles.

The incident **precipitate**d a political crisis.

**shorten** Make (a vowel or syllable) short.

Patients whose waiting time had been **shorten**ed.

**shortened** Edit by omitting or modifying parts considered indelicate.

telescope Make smaller or shorter.

Five steel sections that **telescope** into one another.

**truncated** Make shorter as if by cutting off.

- The cold air condensed the steam.
- The cold air was condensing his breath.
- Condense the milk.
