supporter	Someone who supports or champions something. <i>All their supporters came out for the game.</i>

assassination	An attack intended to ruin someone's reputation. <i>A wave of bombings and assassinations.</i>
coalescing	Growing together, fusing.
coeducation	Education of men and women in the same institutions.
<u>collective</u>	A collective farm. <i>The anarchist collective and bookshop.</i>
<u>collusion</u>	Collusion between ostensible opponents in a lawsuit. <i>The armed forces were working in collusion with drug traffickers.</i>
complicity	The fact or condition of being involved with others in an activity that is unlawful or morally wrong. <i>They were accused of complicity in the attempt to overthrow the government.</i>
concerted	Jointly arranged or carried out; coordinated. <i>A concerted attempt to preserve religious unity.</i>
connivance	Agreement on a secret plot. <i>This infringement of the law had taken place with the connivance of officials.</i>
<u>consolidate</u>	Combine (a number of financial accounts or funds) into a single overall account or set of accounts. <i>Consolidate fibers into boards.</i>
<u>conspiracy</u>	The action of plotting or conspiring. <i>They were cleared of conspiracy to pervert the course of justice.</i>
conspirator	A person who takes part in a conspiracy. <i>Conspirators had planned to seize the state.</i>
<u>cooperative</u>	(of a farm, business, etc.) owned and run jointly by its members, with profits or benefits shared among them. <i>Every member has clearly defined tasks in a cooperative enterprise.</i>
epigone	An inferior imitator of some distinguished writer or artist of musician. <i>The humdrum compositions of some of Beethoven s epigones.</i>
henchman	(in Scotland) the principal attendant of a Highland chief. <i>The dictator s henchman.</i>
<u>implicate</u>	Bear some of the responsibility for (an action or process, especially a criminal or harmful one). <i>He implicated his government in the murders of three judges.</i>
include	Add as part of something else; put in as part of a set, group, or category. <i>We must include this chemical element in the group.</i>

legalization	The action of making something that was previously illegal permissible by law. <i>Calls for the legalization of cannabis.</i>
<u>liability</u>	The state of being legally responsible for something. <i>Once you contact the card protection scheme your liability for any loss ends.</i>
<u>merge</u>	Mix together different elements. <i>He crouched low and endeavoured to merge into the darkness of the forest.</i>
<u>minion</u>	A servile or fawning dependant. <i>He gets oppressed minions like me to fob them off.</i>
<u>prisoner</u>	A person who is confined especially a prisoner of war. <i>200 rebels were taken prisoner.</i>
<u>syndicate</u>	Organize into or form a syndicate. <i>The stallion was syndicated for a record 5 4 million.</i>
<u>testimony</u>	An assertion offering firsthand authentication of a fact. <i>According to his own testimony he can t do it.</i>
tort	(law) any wrongdoing for which an action for damages may be brought. <i>Public nuisance is a crime as well as a tort.</i>
<u>united</u>	Characterized by unity; being or joined into a single entity. <i>Women acting together in a united way.</i>
