<b>helper</b>	A person who helps people or institutions (especially with financial help). <i>We rely on volunteer <b>helpers</b>.</i>
<b>henchman</b>	(in Scotland) the principal attendant of a Highland chief. <i>The dictator s <b>henchman</b>.</i>
<b>partner</b>	A person s partner in marriage. <i>Sexual <b>partners</b>.</i>
<b>partner in crime</b>	A person's partner in marriage.
<b>supporter</b>	Someone who supports or champions something. <i>All their <b>supporters</b> came out for the game.</i>

<b>federated</b>	United under a central government. <i>A <b>federated</b> state consisting of 15 union republics.</i>
<b>in alliance</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in league</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b><u>united</u></b>	Characterized by unity; being or joined into a single entity. <i>Presented a <b>united</b> front.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Confederate" as an adjective

- *Some local groups united to form confederate councils.*
- *The Confederate flag.*



## Associations of "Confederate" (30 Words)

- accomplice** A person who joins with another in carrying out some plan (especially an unethical or illegal plan).  
*An **accomplice** in the murder.*
- allied** Connected; related.  
*The **allied** fleet.*
- amnesty** Grant a pardon to (a group of people).  
*A month long weapons **amnesty**.*
- arrest** Attract and fix.  
*The spread of the disease can be **arrested**.*
- assassin** A member of the Nizari branch of Ismaili Muslims at the time of the Crusades, when the newly established sect ruled part of northern Persia (1094-1256). They were renowned as militant fanatics, and were popularly reputed to use hashish before going on murder missions.  
*His **assassins** were hunted down like animals.*

<b>assassination</b>	An attack intended to ruin someone's reputation. <i>A wave of bombings and <b>assassinations</b>.</i>
<b>coalescing</b>	Growing together, fusing.
<b>coeducation</b>	Education of men and women in the same institutions.
<b><u>collective</u></b>	A collective farm. <i>The anarchist <b>collective</b> and bookshop.</i>
<b><u>collusion</u></b>	Collusion between ostensible opponents in a lawsuit. <i>The armed forces were working in <b>collusion</b> with drug traffickers.</i>
<b>complicity</b>	The fact or condition of being involved with others in an activity that is unlawful or morally wrong. <i>They were accused of <b>complicity</b> in the attempt to overthrow the government.</i>
<b>concerted</b>	Jointly arranged or carried out; coordinated. <i>A <b>concerted</b> attempt to preserve religious unity.</i>
<b>connivance</b>	Agreement on a secret plot. <i>This infringement of the law had taken place with the <b>connivance</b> of officials.</i>
<b><u>consolidate</u></b>	Combine (a number of financial accounts or funds) into a single overall account or set of accounts. <i><b>Consolidate</b> fibers into boards.</i>
<b><u>conspiracy</u></b>	The action of plotting or conspiring. <i>They were cleared of <b>conspiracy</b> to pervert the course of justice.</i>
<b>conspirator</b>	A person who takes part in a conspiracy. <i><b>Conspirators</b> had planned to seize the state.</i>
<b><u>cooperative</u></b>	(of a farm, business, etc.) owned and run jointly by its members, with profits or benefits shared among them. <i>Every member has clearly defined tasks in a <b>cooperative</b> enterprise.</i>
<b>epigone</b>	An inferior imitator of some distinguished writer or artist of musician. <i>The humdrum compositions of some of Beethoven s <b>epigones</b>.</i>
<b>henchman</b>	(in Scotland) the principal attendant of a Highland chief. <i>The dictator s <b>henchman</b>.</i>
<b><u>implicate</u></b>	Bear some of the responsibility for (an action or process, especially a criminal or harmful one). <i>He <b>implicated</b> his government in the murders of three judges.</i>
<b>include</b>	Add as part of something else; put in as part of a set, group, or category. <i>We must <b>include</b> this chemical element in the group.</i>

<b>legalization</b>	The action of making something that was previously illegal permissible by law. <i>Calls for the <b>legalization</b> of cannabis.</i>
<u><a href="#">liability</a></u>	The state of being legally responsible for something. <i>Once you contact the card protection scheme your <b>liability</b> for any loss ends.</i>
<u><a href="#">merge</a></u>	Mix together different elements. <i>He crouched low and endeavoured to <b>merge</b> into the darkness of the forest.</i>
<u><a href="#">minion</a></u>	A servile or fawning dependant. <i>He gets oppressed <b>minions</b> like me to fob them off.</i>
<u><a href="#">prisoner</a></u>	A person who is confined especially a prisoner of war. <i>200 rebels were taken <b>prisoner</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">syndicate</a></u>	Organize into or form a syndicate. <i>The stallion was <b>syndicated</b> for a record 5 4 million.</i>
<u><a href="#">testimony</a></u>	An assertion offering firsthand authentication of a fact. <i>According to his own <b>testimony</b> he can t do it.</i>
<b>tort</b>	(law) any wrongdoing for which an action for damages may be brought. <i>Public nuisance is a crime as well as a <b>tort</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">united</a></u>	Characterized by unity; being or joined into a single entity. <i>Women acting together in a <b>united</b> way.</i>
