
According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "confederate" as a verb can have the following definitions:



| <u>assassin</u> | A member of the Nizari branch of Ismaili Muslims at the time of the Crusades, when the newly established sect ruled part of northern Persia (1094–1256). They were renowned as militant fanatics, and were popularly reputed to use hashish before going on murder missions. <i>His</i> assassin s were hunted down like animals. |



| assassination | An attack intended to ruin someone's reputation. A wave of bombings and assassination s. |

| coalescing | Growing together, fusing. |
| coeducation | Education of men and women in the same institutions. |
| <u>collective</u> | A collective farm. The anarchist collective and bookshop. |
| <u>collusion</u> | Collusion between ostensible opponents in a lawsuit. The armed forces were working in collusion with drug traffickers. |
| complicity | The fact or condition of being involved with others in an activity that is unlawful or morally wrong. They were accused of complicity in the attempt to overthrow the government. |
| concerted | Jointly arranged or carried out; coordinated. A concerted attempt to preserve religious unity. |
| connivance | Agreement on a secret plot. This infringement of the law had taken place with the connivance of officials. |
| <u>consolidate</u> | Combine (a number of financial accounts or funds) into a single overall account or set of accounts. <i>Consolidate</i> fibers into boards. |
| <u>conspiracy</u> | The action of plotting or conspiring. They were cleared of conspiracy to pervert the course of justice. |
| conspirator | A person who takes part in a conspiracy. Conspirator s had planned to seize the state. |
| <u>cooperative</u> | (of a farm, business, etc.) owned and run jointly by its members, with profits or benefits shared among them. Every member has clearly defined tasks in a cooperative enterprise. |
| epigone | An inferior imitator of some distinguished writer or artist of musician. The humdrum compositions of some of Beethoven s epigone s. |
| henchman | (in Scotland) the principal attendant of a Highland chief. <i>The dictator s henchman</i> . |
| <u>implicate</u> | Bear some of the responsibility for (an action or process, especially a criminal or harmful one. He implicate d his government in the murders of three judges. |
| include | Add as part of something else; put in as part of a set, group, or category. We must include this chemical element in the group. |



| legalization | The action of making something that was previously illegal permissible by law. Calls for the legalization of cannabis. |

| <u>liability</u> | The state of being legally responsible for something. Once you contact the card protection scheme your liability for any loss ends. |
