affiliation	The state or process of affiliating or being affiliated. Welcomed the <b>affiliation</b> of the research center with the university.
alliance	A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim. <i>An alliance</i> between medicine and morality.
association	The state of being connected together as in memory or imagination. His <b>association</b> of his father with being beaten was too strong to break.
band	A stripe or stripes of contrasting color. Victoria settled the velvet <b>band</b> on her hair.
<u>circle</u>	Something in the shape of a circle. <i>The lamp spread a circle of light.</i>
<u>coalition</u>	A temporary alliance for combined action, especially of political parties forming a government. They had a taste of government in <b>coalition</b> with the Social Democrats.



combine	A consortium of independent organizations formed to limit competition by controlling the production and distribution of a product or service. <i>One of the world s biggest food and personal products combines.</i>
<u>compact</u>	A mass of powdered metal compacted together in preparation for sintering. <i>Strength is then introduced by infiltrating glass into the</i> <b>compact</b> .
confederacy	A union of people or groups formed for an illicit purpose. The Yakuza is a secret <b>confederacy</b> of criminal fraternities.
conglomerate	A thing consisting of a number of different and distinct parts or items that are grouped together. A media <b>conglomerate</b> .
<u>consortium</u>	An association of companies for some definite purpose. <i>The amount awarded for loss of <b>consortium</b> must be included.</i>
<u>cooperative</u>	An association formed and operated for the benefit of those using it. We run the agency as a workers <b>cooperative</b> .
<u>federation</u>	An organization formed by merging several groups or parties. A first step in the <b>federation</b> of Europe.
fellowship	The status of a fellow of a college or society. The church welcomed new members into its <b>fellowship</b> .
group	A set of elements, together with an associative binary operation, which contains an inverse for each element and an identity element. <i>A methyl group</i> .
<u>league</u>	The contest for the championship of a league. The two men were not in the same <b>league</b> .
partnership	A cooperative relationship between people or groups who agree to share responsibility for achieving some specific goal. The <b>partnership</b> now owns 22 department stores.
ring	The sound of a bell ringing E A Poe. A gas <b>ring</b> .
<u>syndicate</u>	An association or agency supplying material simultaneously to a number of newspapers or periodicals. Large scale buyouts involving a <b>syndicate</b> of financial institutions.






### Usage Examples of "Confederation" as a noun

affiliation	The state or process of affiliating or being affiliated. Welcomed the <b>affiliation</b> of the research center with the university.
alliance	A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim. <i>The shifting alliances within a large family.</i>
<u>ally</u>	Become an ally or associate as by a treaty or marriage. <i>He s a good <b>ally</b> in fight.</i>
<u>annex</u>	A building joined to or associated with a main building, providing additional space or accommodation. <i>Hitler</i> <b>annex</b> ed <i>Lithuania</i> .



A stable plant community including a characteristic group of dominant plant species. Conditioning is a form of learning by <b>association</b> .
A nightclub playing fashionable dance music. The gossip columnist got his information by visiting night <b>club</b> s every night.
The union of diverse things into one body or form or group; the growing together of parts. The lack of <b>coalescence</b> among fields of science.
The state of being combined into one body. A <b>coalition</b> between Liberals and Conservatives.
Something produced in collaboration with someone. They worked either in <b>collaboration</b> or independently.
A sequence of numbers or letters used to open a combination lock. These four factors work together in <b>combination</b> .
Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>Combine</i> resources.
A secret agreement between two or more people to perform an unlawful act. <i>The Yakuza is a secret</i> <b>confederacy</b> of criminal fraternities.
A mixture of two partially miscible liquids A and B produces two conjugate solutions one of A in B and another of B in A. Bilirubin is then <b>conjugate</b> d by liver enzymes and excreted in the bile.
The action or process of combining a number of things into a single more effective or coherent whole. A <b>consolidation</b> of data within an enterprise.
Joint operation or action. They worked in close <b>cooperation</b> with the British Tourist Authority.
An organization or group within which smaller divisions have some degree of internal autonomy. <i>A first step in the <b>federation</b> of Europe.</i>
An occurrence that involves the production of a union. The election results produced pressure for <b>fusion</b> of the parties.
A group of species that have similar requirements and play a similar role within a community.
