<b>combine</b>	A consortium of independent organizations formed to limit competition by controlling the production and distribution of a product or service. <i>One of the world s biggest food and personal products <b>combines</b>.</i>
<b><u>compact</u></b>	A mass of powdered metal compacted together in preparation for sintering. <i>Strength is then introduced by infiltrating glass into the <b>compact</b>.</i>
<b>confederacy</b>	A union of people or groups formed for an illicit purpose. <i>The Yakuza is a secret <b>confederacy</b> of criminal fraternities.</i>
<b>conglomerate</b>	A thing consisting of a number of different and distinct parts or items that are grouped together. <i>A media <b>conglomerate</b>.</i>
<b><u>consortium</u></b>	An association of companies for some definite purpose. <i>The amount awarded for loss of <b>consortium</b> must be included.</i>
<b><u>cooperative</u></b>	An association formed and operated for the benefit of those using it. <i>We run the agency as a workers <b>cooperative</b>.</i>
<b><u>federation</u></b>	An organization formed by merging several groups or parties. <i>A first step in the <b>federation</b> of Europe.</i>
<b>fellowship</b>	The status of a fellow of a college or society. <i>The church welcomed new members into its <b>fellowship</b>.</i>
<b>group</b>	A set of elements, together with an associative binary operation, which contains an inverse for each element and an identity element. <i>A methyl <b>group</b>.</i>
<b><u>league</u></b>	The contest for the championship of a league. <i>The two men were not in the same <b>league</b>.</i>
<b>partnership</b>	A cooperative relationship between people or groups who agree to share responsibility for achieving some specific goal. <i>The <b>partnership</b> now owns 22 department stores.</i>
<b>ring</b>	The sound of a bell ringing E A Poe. <i>A gas <b>ring</b>.</i>
<b><u>syndicate</u></b>	An association or agency supplying material simultaneously to a number of newspapers or periodicals. <i>Large scale buyouts involving a <b>syndicate</b> of financial institutions.</i>

- ally** Become an ally or associate as by a treaty or marriage.

- annex** A building joined to or associated with a main building, providing additional space or accommodation.

<b>association</b>	A stable plant community including a characteristic group of dominant plant species. <i>Conditioning is a form of learning by <b>association</b>.</i>
<b>club</b>	A nightclub playing fashionable dance music. <i>The gossip columnist got his information by visiting night<b>clubs</b> every night.</i>
<b>coalescence</b>	The union of diverse things into one body or form or group; the growing together of parts. <i>The lack of <b>coalescence</b> among fields of science.</i>
<b>coalition</b>	The state of being combined into one body. <i>A <b>coalition</b> between Liberals and Conservatives.</i>
<b>collaboration</b>	Something produced in collaboration with someone. <i>They worked either in <b>collaboration</b> or independently.</i>
<b>combination</b>	A sequence of numbers or letters used to open a combination lock. <i>These four factors work together in <b>combination</b>.</i>
<b>combine</b>	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i><b>Combine</b> resources.</i>
<b>confederacy</b>	A secret agreement between two or more people to perform an unlawful act. <i>The Yakuza is a secret <b>confederacy</b> of criminal fraternities.</i>
<b>conjugate</b>	A mixture of two partially miscible liquids A and B produces two conjugate solutions one of A in B and another of B in A. <i>Bilirubin is then <b>conjugated</b> by liver enzymes and excreted in the bile.</i>
<b>consolidation</b>	The action or process of combining a number of things into a single more effective or coherent whole. <i>A <b>consolidation</b> of data within an enterprise.</i>
<b>cooperation</b>	Joint operation or action. <i>They worked in close <b>cooperation</b> with the British Tourist Authority.</i>
<b>federation</b>	An organization or group within which smaller divisions have some degree of internal autonomy. <i>A first step in the <b>federation</b> of Europe.</i>
<b>fusion</b>	An occurrence that involves the production of a union. <i>The election results produced pressure for <b>fusion</b> of the parties.</i>
<b>guild</b>	A group of species that have similar requirements and play a similar role within a community.
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>Cities efforts to <b>integrate</b>.</i>
<b>integrated</b>	Resembling a living organism in organization or development. <i>An <b>integrated</b> Europe.</i>

<b><u>league</u></b>	Join in a league or alliance. <i>Austin s in a <b>league</b> of his own.</i>
<b>membership</b>	The body of members of an organization or group. <i>A <b>membership</b> card.</i>
<b><u>national</u></b>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i><b>National</b> forests.</i>
<b>reunify</b>	Restore political unity to (a place or group, especially a divided territory). <i>Will Korea <b>reunify</b>.</i>
<b>synthesis</b>	The tendency in a language to use inflected forms rather than word order to express grammatical structure. <i>The ideology represented a <b>synthesis</b> of certain ideas.</i>
<b>unification</b>	The process of being united or made into a whole. <i>The costs of German <b>unification</b>.</i>
<b><u>unify</u></b>	Make or become united, uniform, or whole. <i>The government hoped to centralize and <b>unify</b> the nation.</i>
<b><u>union</u></b>	The operation of forming a union. <i>Let C be the <b>union</b> of the sets A and B.</i>
<b>unite</b>	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>They are <b>united</b> by their love of cars.</i>
<b><u>united</u></b>	Characterized by unity; being or joined into a single entity. <i>Presented a <b>united</b> front.</i>
