<b>converse</b>	Carry on a conversation. <i>She was withdrawn and preoccupied hardly able to <b>converse</b> with her mother.</i>
<b>decorate with</b>	Award a mark of honor, such as a medal, to.

<b>discuss things</b>	Speak with others about (something); talk (something) over in detail; have a discussion.
<b>endow with</b>	Furnish with an endowment.
<b>exchange views</b>	Hand over one and receive another, approximately equivalent.
<b>extend to</b>	Reach outward in space.
<b>gift with</b>	Give as a present; make a gift of.
<b>give out to</b>	Offer in good faith.
<b>give to</b>	Estimate the duration or outcome of something.
<b>grant to</b>	Let have.
<b>hand out to</b>	Guide or conduct or usher somewhere.
<b>have a chat</b>	Cause to move; cause to be in a certain position or condition.
<b>have a talk</b>	Undergo (as of injuries and illnesses).
<b>have a tête-à-tête</b>	Have left.
<b>have discussions</b>	Have as a feature.
<b>honour with</b>	Bestow honor or rewards upon.
<b>present to</b>	Bring forward and present to the mind.
<b>present with</b>	Introduce.
<b>speak</b>	Use language. <i>I ll <b>speak</b> to him if he calls.</i>
<b>talk</b>	Exchange thoughts talk with. <i>We re <b>talking</b> big money.</i>
<b>vest in</b>	Clothe formally; especially in ecclesiastical robes.
<b>vouchsafe to</b>	Grant in a condescending manner.

- *The Minister may have exceeded the powers conferred on him by Parliament.*
- *We conferred about a plan of action.*

<b>consult</b>	An act of consulting a professional a consultation. <i>They had to <b>consult</b> before arriving at a decision.</i>
<b>consultant</b>	A person who provides expert advice professionally. <i>He acted as campaign <b>consultant</b> to the president.</i>
<b><u>counsel</u></b>	A barrister or other legal adviser conducting a case. <i>He was <b>counselled</b> by his supporters to return to Germany.</i>
<b>dialog</b>	A conversation between two persons.
<b><u>dialogue</u></b>	Provide a film or play with a dialogue. <i>The USA would enter into a direct <b>dialogue</b> with Vietnam.</i>
<b><u>discourse</u></b>	Written or spoken communication or debate. <i>She could <b>discourse</b> at great length on the history of Europe.</i>

<b>discuss</b>	Speak with others about something talk something over in detail have a discussion. <i>They were <b>discussing</b> where to go for a drink.</i>
<b>enable</b>	Make (something) possible. <i>You can <b>enable</b> compression or even virus scanning prior to backup.</i>
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>The old <b>endowed</b> grammar schools.</i>
<b>give</b>	Give as a present make a gift of. <i>This student <b>gives</b> promise of real creativity.</i>
<b>grant</b>	A contract granting the right to operate a subsidiary business. <i><b>Grant</b> a privilege.</i>
<b>interact</b>	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>People who <b>interact</b> daily.</i>
