bestow Bestow a quality on.

confab Engage in informal private conversation.

Peter was **confab**bing with a curly haired guy.

confabulate Have a conference in order to talk something over.

She could be heard on the telephone confabulating with someone.

Have discussions with (someone), typically before undertaking a course of

consult action.

She consulted a large desk diary.

Usage Examples of "Confers" as a verb

• We conferred about a plan of action.

• The university conferred a degree on its most famous former student, who never graduated.

afford Afford access to.

It was taking up more time than he could **afford**.

Allow the presence of or allow an activity without opposing or

allow prohibiting.

We don t **allow** dogs here.

bestowBestow a quality on.

The office was **bestow**ed on him by the monarch of this realm.

capitulate Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield.

The patriots had to **capitulate** to the enemy forces.

chat Birds having a chattering call.

He dropped in for a chat.

chatter Cut unevenly with a chattering tool.

She was **chatter**ing about her holiday.

communication Means of travelling or of transporting goods, such as roads or railways.
