### Definitions of "Confers" as a verb

## Synonyms of "Confers" as a verb (4 Words)

<b>bestow</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i>Stooping to <b>bestow</b> the presents into eager hands.</i>
<b>confab</b>	Engage in informal private conversation. <i>Peter was <b>confabbing</b> with a curly haired guy.</i>
<b>confabulate</b>	Have a conference in order to talk something over. <i>She could be heard on the telephone confabulating with someone.</i>
<b>consult</b>	Have discussions with (someone), typically before undertaking a course of action. <i>She <b>consulted</b> a large desk diary.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Confers" as a verb

- *We conferred about a plan of action.*
- *The university conferred a degree on its most famous former student, who never graduated.*

## Associations of "Confers" (30 Words)

<u>afford</u>	Afford access to. <i>It was taking up more time than he could <b>afford</b>.</i>
allow	Allow the presence of or allow an activity without opposing or prohibiting. <i>We don't <b>allow</b> dogs here.</i>
bestow	Bestow a quality on. <i>The office was <b>bestowed</b> on him by the monarch of this realm.</i>
capitulate	Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield. <i>The patriots had to <b>capitulate</b> to the enemy forces.</i>
<u>chat</u>	Birds having a chattering call. <i>He dropped in for a <b>chat</b>.</i>
chatter	Cut unevenly with a chattering tool. <i>She was <b>chattering</b> about her holiday.</i>
communication	Means of travelling or of transporting goods, such as roads or railways. <i>How many lines of <b>communication</b> can there be among four people.</i>
<u>concede</u>	Be willing to concede. <i>The candidate <b>conceded</b> after enough votes had come in to show that he would lose.</i>
concession	A preferential allowance or rate given by an organization. <i>There are <b>concessions</b> on party bookings.</i>
confabulate	Unconsciously replace fact with fantasy in one's memory. <i>She could be heard on the telephone confabulating with someone.</i>
<u>conference</u>	Take part in a conference or conference call. <i>I <b>conferenced</b> with a senior analyst at the Congressional Research Service.</i>
consult	An act of consulting a professional a consultation. <i>She <b>consulted</b> a large desk diary.</i>
consultant	A person who provides expert advice professionally. <i>He acted as campaign <b>consultant</b> to the president.</i>
<u>counsel</u>	Recommend (a course of action). <i>He was being <b>counselled</b> for depression.</i>
dialog	The lines spoken by characters in drama or fiction.
<u>dialogue</u>	Provide a film or play with a dialogue. <i>Passages of <b>dialogue</b>.</i>

<b><u>discourse</u></b>	A connected series of utterances; a text or conversation. <i>An imagined <b>discourse</b> between two people.</i>
<b>discuss</b>	Speak with others about something talk something over in detail have a discussion. <i>They were <b>discussing</b> where to go for a drink.</i>
<b>enable</b>	Render capable or able for some task. <i>The evidence would <b>enable</b> us to arrive at firm conclusions.</i>
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>He <b>endowed</b> three chairs at Liverpool University.</i>
<b><u>give</u></b>	Yield or give way to pressure. <i>For the first offence I was <b>given</b> a fine.</i>
<b>grant</b>	The action of granting something. <i>This bill <b>grants</b> us new rights.</i>
<b><u>interact</u></b>	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>The user <b>interacts</b> directly with the library.</i>
<b>keynote</b>	Set the keynote of. <i>He delivered the <b>keynote</b> address.</i>
<b><u>patent</u></b>	Grant rights to grant a patent for. <i>His behavior has <b>patented</b> an embarrassing fact about him.</i>
<b>prate</b>	Speak (about unimportant matters) rapidly and incessantly. <i>I heard him <b>prate</b> on for at least an hour and a half.</i>
<b>presentation</b>	A visual representation of something. <i>She gave the trophy but he made the <b>presentation</b>.</i>
<b>speak</b>	(of a hound) bark. <i>Insufficient air circulates for the pipes to <b>speak</b>.</i>
<b>talk</b>	Deliver a lecture or talk. <i>The company is <b>talking</b> with a few private equity firms.</i>
<b>verbosity</b>	The fact or quality of using more words than needed; wordiness. <i>A critic with a reputation for <b>verbosity</b>.</i>
