Definitions of "Confers" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “confers” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Have a conference in order to talk something over.*
- *Present.*



Synonyms of "Confers" as a verb (4 Words)

- bestow** Bestow a quality on.
*Stooping to **bestow** the presents into eager hands.*
- confab** Engage in informal private conversation.
*Peter was **confabbing** with a curly haired guy.*
- confabulate** Have a conference in order to talk something over.
*She could be heard on the telephone **confabulating** with someone.*
- consult** Have discussions with (someone), typically before undertaking a course of action.
*She **consulted** a large desk diary.*

Usage Examples of "Confers" as a verb

- *We conferred about a plan of action.*
- *The university conferred a degree on its most famous former student, who never graduated.*

Associations of "Confers" (30 Words)

<u>afford</u>	Afford access to. <i>It was taking up more time than he could afford.</i>
allow	Allow the presence of or allow an activity without opposing or prohibiting. <i>We don't allow dogs here.</i>
bestow	Bestow a quality on. <i>The office was bestowed on him by the monarch of this realm.</i>
capitulate	Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield. <i>The patriots had to capitulate to the enemy forces.</i>
<u>chat</u>	Birds having a chattering call. <i>He dropped in for a chat.</i>
chatter	Cut unevenly with a chattering tool. <i>She was chattering about her holiday.</i>
communication	Means of travelling or of transporting goods, such as roads or railways. <i>How many lines of communication can there be among four people.</i>
<u>concede</u>	Be willing to concede. <i>The candidate conceded after enough votes had come in to show that he would lose.</i>
concession	A preferential allowance or rate given by an organization. <i>There are concessions on party bookings.</i>
confabulate	Unconsciously replace fact with fantasy in one's memory. <i>She could be heard on the telephone confabulating with someone.</i>
<u>conference</u>	Take part in a conference or conference call. <i>I conferenced with a senior analyst at the Congressional Research Service.</i>
consult	An act of consulting a professional a consultation. <i>She consulted a large desk diary.</i>
consultant	A person who provides expert advice professionally. <i>He acted as campaign consultant to the president.</i>
<u>counsel</u>	Recommend (a course of action). <i>He was being counselled for depression.</i>
dialog	The lines spoken by characters in drama or fiction.
<u>dialogue</u>	Provide a film or play with a dialogue. <i>Passages of dialogue.</i>

<u>discourse</u>	A connected series of utterances; a text or conversation. <i>An imagined discourse between two people.</i>
discuss	Speak with others about something talk something over in detail have a discussion. <i>They were discussing where to go for a drink.</i>
enable	Render capable or able for some task. <i>The evidence would enable us to arrive at firm conclusions.</i>
endow	Furnish with an endowment. <i>He endowed three chairs at Liverpool University.</i>
<u>give</u>	Yield or give way to pressure. <i>For the first offence I was given a fine.</i>
grant	The action of granting something. <i>This bill grants us new rights.</i>
<u>interact</u>	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>The user interacts directly with the library.</i>
keynote	Set the keynote of. <i>He delivered the keynote address.</i>
<u>patent</u>	Grant rights to grant a patent for. <i>His behavior has patented an embarrassing fact about him.</i>
prate	Speak (about unimportant matters) rapidly and incessantly. <i>I heard him prate on for at least an hour and a half.</i>
presentation	A visual representation of something. <i>She gave the trophy but he made the presentation.</i>
speak	(of a hound) bark. <i>Insufficient air circulates for the pipes to speak.</i>
talk	Deliver a lecture or talk. <i>The company is talking with a few private equity firms.</i>
verbosity	The fact or quality of using more words than needed; wordiness. <i>A critic with a reputation for verbosity.</i>
