and (often) smoke.



aflame Keenly excited (especially sexually) or indicating excitement- Bram Stoker.

alight Lighted up by or as by fire or flame.

**extinguish** Extinguish by crushing.

A look which would have **extinguish**ed any man.

**firefighter** A member of a fire department who tries to extinguish fires.

Shine or glow like a flame.

Your opinions and mine are probably different but please don t **flame** me.

Informal intensifiers.
